Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached award of competitive contracts, rejection of bids, and contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board. Allocations have been rounded consistent with standard auditing practices.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew (OTR) and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the each contract.

Background

Section 1 AWARD OF COMPETITIVE BIDS

The contracts listed in this section are being recommended for award to the responsive, responsible bidder(s) who met the requirements of the respective solicitation.

Item 1.1: Power Generating Systems, Maintenance, Repair and Purchase is to award this contract for purchase of power generating systems, repair services and maintenance for the Miami-Dade Aviation and Fire Rescue departments. The amount being requested is **\$1,011,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the two, two-year OTR periods, the cumulative value will be **\$3,033,000**.

Item 1.2: Chemical and Biological Testing and Sampling Services is to award this contract for chemical and biological testing and sampling services for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$987,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the four, one-year OTR periods, the cumulative value will be **\$4,935,000**.

Section 2 REJECTED BIDS

A bid may be rejected when adverse conditions exist such as the proposal not conforming to the specifications and/or solicitation documents, insufficient financial resources, technical ability, physical capacity and/or skill of the vendor, unfair and unreasonable pricing, insufficient competition and for any other cause in the best interest of the County.

Section 3 COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A competitive contract modification is an award of a supplemental allocation for goods or services within the scope of the original contract award.

Item 3.1: Towing and Disposal of Abandoned Vehicles/Property is to modify this contract to add an allocation funded by MDT Operating fund for towing and disposal services for the Miami-Dade Transit Department. The additional amount being requested is **\$2,000**.

Section 4: PURCHASES MADE UNDER COMPETITIVELY AWARDED CONTRACTS OF OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES

The County may access contracts competed and awarded by federal, state and local governments when it is legally permissible, and it is determined to be in the best interest of the County, and the item is not available through an existing County contract.

BACKGROUND

This contract will provide preventative maintenance and repair services for generators for the Miami-Dade Aviation (MDAD) and Miami-Dade Fire Rescue (MDFR) departments. A total of 63 generators in MDAD ranging from 15 KW to 2000 KW, will be serviced. The generators are located in Miami International, Opa-Locka, Tamiami, Homestead, and Dade-Collier Training and Transition Airports. These generators are critical to operations as they are used to provide backup power during emergency situations to emergency lighting throughout the facility, airfield lighting systems, fire alarms, fire pump and suppression system controls, smoke evacuation systems, elevators, the People Mover System, UPS computer rooms, sewer lift stations, storm drainage pumping stations, and the Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning systems. Regular maintenance on these generators is currently performed by MDAD's personnel. MDAD staff cannot continue to support the required level of effort to properly service the generators. The increase in allocation is to cover the monthly and annual maintenance and repair services to MDAD's 63 power generation units which were not covered by the previous contract.

MDFR will service approximately 52 generators ranging from 31 KW to 215 KW. These generators are distributed throughout 51 fire stations as well as the Inventory and Supply Bureau Building. The generators provide backup power to all 51 fire stations during emergency situations.

The Local Preference affected the award of Group B. The local preference was applied to the lowest non-local vendors' price. The secondary vendors' price was within the 10 percent range. The two vendors participated in a Best and Final bid. The local vendor offered the lowest price and was awarded as primary, and the non-local vendor was awarded as secondary for Group B.

Subject: Request for Responsiveness Determination on ITB No. 9208-2/16 (Power Generating Systems, Maintenance, Repair and Purchase)

You have asked this office if bids submitted by various vendors are responsive to ITB No. 9208-2/16 (Power Generating Systems, Maintenance, Repair and Purchase).

FACTS

We rely on the information you have provided us in a memorandum dated February 24, 2010, a copy of which is attached, two meetings regarding the solicitation and bids at issue, your email to me dated March 16, 2010 and the terms of the ITB itself and the bid submissions at issue.

The purpose of the solicitation is to establish a contract for the inspection, testing, preventative maintenance, parts and repair services, and purchase of various types of generators in conjunction with the County's needs on an as needed basis. The contract will be awarded to multiple vendors by group. Group A establishes an open pre-qualification pool of vendors for the purchase of power generating systems. Groups B - D are price solicitations for the maintenance and repair of power generating systems. Awards for Groups B - D will be awarded on a group-by-group basis to the two lowest priced, responsive and responsible vendors. Accordingly, to be considered for award for Groups B - D, the vendor is required to submit prices for all items in a given group.

The bid requires the vendor bidders to hold a valid Electrical Contractor License (State Certified or Miami-Dade County Registered), or Mechanical Contractor License (State Certified or Miami-Dade County Registered). The County may at its option and in its best interest allow the vendor to supply the subcontractor(s) certificate to the County during the offer evaluation period. Additionally, per Addendum No. 1 vendors are allowed to provide alternatively a General Contractor License.

In an email dated March 15, 2010 you informed me that prior to advertising the solicitation, the scope of the bid was sent to the Building Code Compliance Office (BCCO) for its review and recommendation. You informed me that the BCCO recommended that the scope of work involves both electrical and mechanical work in power generating systems (engines, generators, transfer switches and switchgears) for the support of different operations at the airport and fire stations. Accordingly, BCCO recommended that the bid require vendors to be either a licensed electrical contractor or mechanical contractor. As noted above, Addendum No. 1 allowed vendors to provide, alternatively, a General Contractor's License.

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Various issues have arisen regarding vendors under groups B - D.¹ These vendor issues can be categorized into three issues: (1) not holding any contracting license (including electrical or mechanical contracting license); (2) not bidding all items in a group; and (3) not submitting vendor affidavits.

DISCUSSION

In general, a bid may be rejected or disregarded if there is a material variance between the proposal and the advertisement. A minor variance, however, will not invalidate the proposal. See Robinson Elec. Co. v. Dade County, 417 So. 2d 1032, 1034 (Fla. 3d DCA 1982). The determination of whether a variance or irregularity is minor is fact specific and may differ from bid to bid. Florida courts have used a two part test to determine if a specific noncompliance in a bid would constitute a substantial and, thus, nonwaivable issue: (1) whether the effect of the waiver would be to deprive the County of the assurance that the contract would be entered into, performed and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) whether it would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a proposer in a position of advantage over other proposers. See Glatstien v. City of Miami, 399 So. 2d 1005 (Fla. 3d DCA 1981).

Vendors Not Holding Required License

According to the information you provided, various questioned vendors are not licensed contractors of any sort. The work solicited in the bid requires that the vendors be licensed contractors - specifically, a general contractor, electrical contractor or mechanical contractor. Pursuant to the information you provided, the work solicited in the bid requires electrical and mechanical work in power generating systems and, accordingly, only contractors with the requisite contractor's license can perform the work solicited in the bid.

Vendors that do not have any contractor's license (electrical, mechanical or general) are non-responsive. Florida Statutes § 489.127 prohibits anyone from engaging in the business or act in the capacity of a contractor . . . without being duly registered or certified. Similarly, Florida Statutes § 489.531 prohibits a person to practice contracting unless the person is certified or registered.

Accordingly, in Group B vendors American Power Group, Florida Detroit Diesel-Allison, Grove Power, Inc., Pantropic Power, Inc., Power Depot, Inc., Tampa Armature Works, Inc., are non-responsive. Group C vendors American Power Group, Florida Detroit Diesel-Allison, Grove Power, Inc., Power Depot, Inc., Tampa Armature Works, Inc. and Technical Trading Corp. are non-responsive. Group D vendors American Power Group, Florida Detroit Diesel-Allison, Grove Power, Inc., Power Depot, Inc., Tampa Armature Works, Inc. and Technical Trading Corp. are non-responsive.


¹ The February 24, 2010 memorandum highlighted several issues with several vendors who made submissions to be included in the Group A prequalification pool. The vendors did not comply with the terms of the solicitation for various reasons. The County can reject the submissions. The County should certainly reject the submission of Engine Systems, Inc. who took exception to all the terms of the solicitation. Ultimately, however, because Group A is an open pre-qualification pool which allows the County to add or delete vendors as it deems necessary at any time after the initial award, any rejection is without prejudice to the vendors to later be included in the pre-qualification pool when and if such vendors meet the bid submission requirements.

Vendors Not Bidding on All Items in a Group

Group B vendors Pantropic Power, Inc. and Power Depot, Inc. did *not* provide bid prices for all of the items for Group B. Because the solicitation clearly provided that the awards would be on a group-by-group basis and, accordingly, to be eligible for award for a group, the vendor must submit prices for *all* of the items in a group, Pantropic Power, Inc.'s and Power Depot, Inc.'s bids for Group B of the solicitation are incomplete and non-responsive.

Non-submission of County Required Affidavits

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade County Code the questioned vendors (Group B: Gancedo Technologies, Inc.; Group C: Gancedo Technologies, Inc.; and Group D: Gancedo Technologies, Inc.) must submit the required County affidavits and are not eligible for contract award until such affidavits are properly executed and submitted.² Such affidavits, however, must be on file prior to Contract award. See Miami-Dade County Code § 2-8.1(d)(3). Accordingly, the questioned vendors can still submit the affidavits prior to award recommendation.

² Group B vendor Pantropic Power, Inc. also failed to submit a required affidavit. However, Pantropic Power, Inc.'s bid for Group B is non-responsive for failure to bid on all items and for failing to be a licensed contractor. Accordingly, even if Pantropic Power, Inc. did submit its affidavits its bid is still non-responsive.

BACKGROUND

This replacement contract is for purchase of chemical and biological testing and sampling services for various County departments. The contract allows departments to conduct environmental testing and sampling for biological and chemical contaminants at County airports, landfills, waterways, and various other locations. Samples to be tested include, but are not limited to, drinking water, ground water, surface water, saline water, soils, sediments, effluents, hazardous and solid wastes and tissue.

The replacement contract includes three groups to conduct environmental sampling and testing for biological and chemical contamination. REASON FOR CHANGE

The Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) Department is requesting an allocation, funded by MDT Operating funds, for towing and disposal of abandoned property and vehicles. This contract is utilized to tow abandoned cars, boats, trucks, and trailers. The county has been divided into two geographic zones for the purpose of this bid. The North Zone covers the area from NW 12th Street up to the Northern county line, and the South Zone encompasses the area south of NW 12th Street down to the southern county line.
