

ORDINANCE NO. 10-76

ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE RULES OF PROCEDURE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS; AMENDING SECTION 2-1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA REGARDING EXCUSED ABSENCES OF COMMISSIONERS FROM COMMISSION AND COMMITTEE MEETINGS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, County Commissioners may not be able to attend all of the numerous County Commission and committee meetings, due to County, professional or other obligations; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance will give the Clerk of the Board clear direction to note a Commissioner’s excused absence in the meeting minutes in certain circumstances,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 2-1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:¹

Sec. 2-1. RULES OF PROCEDURE OF COUNTY COMMISSION.

PART 4. COMMITTEES

Rule 4.01. Committees.

* * *

- (o) *Members' Attendance.* Committee attendance requirements shall be established by the chairperson of the commission, after receiving recommendations by a commission committee of the whole regarding any attendance requirements. >>Any Commissioner who notifies the Committee Chairperson or the Clerk of the Board that he or she will be absent from a committee meeting prior to the start of such scheduled meeting shall be noted as excused in the minutes of the meeting.<< >>The Clerk of the Board shall note in the minutes when a Commissioner arrives at a committee meeting, if the Commissioner arrives after the meeting has commenced.<<²

PART 5. CONDUCT OF MEETINGS; AGENDA

* * *

Rule 5.02. Roll call.

The clerk shall call the roll of the members and the names of those present shall be entered in the minutes. ~~[[In the event the roll call reflects the absence of any member on official county business that fact shall be noted in the minutes. Any county commissioner who intends to be absent from any commission meeting shall notify the clerk of the board of the intended absence as soon as convenient.]]~~ >>Any Commissioner who notifies the Chairperson or the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners that he or she will be absent from a County Commission meeting prior to the start of such scheduled meeting shall be noted as excused in the minutes of the meeting.<< >>The Clerk of the Board shall note in the minutes when a Commissioner arrives at a County Commission meeting, if the Commissioner arrives after the meeting has commenced.<<

Section 2. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 3. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby



ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.
