

**Subject:** Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Competitively Bid Contracts that Would Bring the Cumulative Contract Value to More than \$1 Million

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in his discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item. Ordinance #07-139 provides for committee review exemption. **Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.**

## Scope

The impact of the item in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

## Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

**Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.** Allocations have been rounded consistent with standard auditing practices.

## Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendor recommended for award in the accompanying agenda item. The departments' contract manager is reflected in the accompanying agenda item.

## Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract listed in the accompanying package.

## Background

The competitively bid contracts listed in this item require approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract that would, if exercised, bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$1 million. Each of the contracts were awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$1 million for competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

Prior to exercising any Options-to-Renew (OTR) periods, market research is conducted to ensure that continuing to purchase from the awarded vendor is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and

lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

**Item No. 1: Central Air Conditioners and Related Ductwork, Pre-qualification of Vendors** seeks authority to exercise the first OTR to purchase, install, and service central air conditioning units. The amount being requested for the first option term is **\$1,499,000**.

**Item No. 2: Title Company Services** seeks authority to exercise the second OTR to procure title company services. The amount being requested for the second option term is **\$244,000**.

**Contract No.:** 8933-1/13

**Contract Title:** **Central Air Conditioners and Related Ductwork, Pre-qualification of Vendors**

**Description:** It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the first Option-to-Renew (OTR) period to purchase, install, and service central air conditioning units. The contract is in its initial two-year period, which expires on February 28, 2011. The contract has a remaining two-year OTR. Exercising the final OTR will bring the cumulative value of the contract to \$3,122,000.

On September 30, 2010, the vendor complied with the insurance requirement and was added to the contract. There are no compliance issues with the remaining vendors.

**Local Preference:** The Local Preference is applied in accordance with the Ordinance at the time of spot market competition.

**Living Wage:** The services being provided are covered under the Davis Bacon Act.

**JUSTIFICATION**

This contract is used by the Miami-Dade Public Housing and Miami-Dade Community Action agencies, to provide air conditioning installation and repair services for low income and elderly residents. Pre-qualified vendors provide quotations for services that include removal of existing central air conditioning units prior to new installations, replacement of thermostats, as well as inspection, installation, sealing, and replacement of existing air conditioning ducts.

At the County's discretion, qualified vendors may be added to this pool. Ten vendors have been added to the contract since its inception. Additionally, there are numerous companies in the process of completing their pre-qualification submittals in order to be added to the pool of vendors. It is therefore in the best interest of the County to exercise the first option-to-renew.

**Contract No.:** EPP-RFP485

**Contract Title:** Title Company Services

**Description:** It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to exercise the second Option-to-Renew (OTR) to procure title company services. The contract is in its first OTR period which expires on February 22, 2011. The contract has two, one-year OTRs remaining. Exercising the second OTR will bring the cumulative value of the contract to \$1,463,000.

**JUSTIFICATION**

The Finance Department's Tax Collector Division uses the services of a title company to provide certified ownership and encumbrance reports for tax deed applications. These reports are required under Section 197.502(4) of the Florida Statutes and Department of Revenue Regulation Rule 12D-13.061. These reports contain lien information on real property for which a tax deed application is filed. The Building Department also uses the services of a title company to provide ownership and encumbrance reports for properties that are deemed unsafe.

Market research shows prices are competitive when compared to other State of Florida counties. The departments continue to require the services offered under this contract. Therefore, it is the best interest of the County to exercise the second option-to-renew.
