

RESOLUTION NO. R-390-11

RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION, THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY, THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY'S OFFICE FOR THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OF FLORIDA, THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT, THE FLORIDA HIGHWAY PATROL, AND THE OFFICE OF THE MIAMI-DADE STATE ATTORNEY TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY AND PROPER ACTIONS TO RETURN NABIL SULAIMAN TO MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO FACE TRIAL IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEATH OF AKIL LARUE OLIVER

WHEREAS, on November 18, 2010, 19 year – old Nabil Sulaiman (“Sulaiman”) was arrested in connection with the murder of Akil Larue Oliver (“Oliver”) at a Miami Convenience store; and

WHEREAS, Sulaiman was charged with aggravated battery and his older brother, 24-year-old Raghed Sulaiman, was charged with murder because the two men allegedly attacked and subsequently killed Oliver in their Quick Stop convenience store; and

WHEREAS, it is reported that Oliver was hit on his head with both a bottle and a crowbar during the alleged beating; and

WHEREAS, after Sulaiman was allowed to post bond in the amount of \$10,000, it is reported that he used his passport to leave the country, in violation of his bail; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of justice, Sulaiman should be immediately returned to Miami-Dade County to face trial in connection with the cruel beating and killing of Oliver,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the United States Department of Justice, the Federal Bureau of Investigations, the Department of Homeland Security, the Office of the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Florida, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, Florida Highway Patrol, and the Office of the Miami-Dade State Attorney to take all necessary and proper actions to return Nabil Sulaiman to Miami-Dade County to face trial in connection with the brutal beating and killing of Akil Larue Oliver.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board of Miami-Dade County to transmit certified copies of this resolution to United States Attorney General Eric Holder, Director of the Federal Bureau of investigations Robert S. Mueller, III, Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security Janet Napolitano, United States Attorney for the Southern District of Florida Wifredo Ferrer, Florida Department of Law Enforcement Commissioner Gerald Bailey, Director of the Florida Highway Patrol Colonel John T. Czernis, and Miami-Dade State Attorney Katherine Fernandez Rundle.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Dennis C. Moss. It was offered by Commissioner **Dennis C. Moss**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Lynda Bell** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
