Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the County Mayor or the Mayor's designee's action to apply for, receive, and expend United States Department of Commerce National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) FY 2011 Community-Based Marine Debris Removal funds in the amount of \$39,325. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or the Mayor's designee to execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and amendments, after approval by the County Attorney, as required by program guidelines. It is also recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or the Mayor's designee to apply for, receive, and expend additional funds that may become available during the term of the grant; to file and execute any amendments to the application for and on behalf of the County; and to exercise amendments, modifications, renewal, cancellation, and termination clauses of any contracts and agreements, subject to the approval of the County Attorney's Office.

The Grant was awarded to the County on June 29, 2011 with an acceptance deadline of thirty days upon receipt. A short extension was provided and the Grant was accepted on August 9, 2011 by the Office of Grants Coordination. The short turnaround time imposed by the NOAA award and their acceptance deadline did not allow sufficient time for the processing of the resolution and its submission to the Board prior to submission and acceptance of the grant award.

Scope

The Miami-Dade Cooperative Extension Office of the Consumer Services Department will administer and coordinate a Derelict Fishing Gear Identification and Removal Project that will: 1) Identify sensitive and impacted areas along the Florida reef tract by developing a derelict fishing gear database using the NOAA Fisheries Reef Visual Census (RVC) data; 2) Develop standardized derelict fishing gear criteria to be adopted by NOAA Fisheries for use in future RVC surveys; 3) Remove lost and abandoned fishing gear in Biscayne Bay and Biscayne National Park; and 4) Focus gear recovery efforts in high density and/or high priority areas to enhance and restore near shore marine ecosystems in Miami-Dade County.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

A grant in the amount of \$39,325 was awarded, that will provide support to implement two deep water and two shallow water marine debris removal projects over a two-year period

Track Record/Monitor

The Miami-Dade Cooperative Extension Office within the Consumer Services Department has extensive experience in the managing of federal and state issued grants and will implement and manage project activities funded through a grant agreement. The Office will handle the disbursement and expenditure of grant funds, and manage programmatic and fiscal reporting in accordance with project reporting and auditing procedures stipulated by NOAA.


Background

Florida has one of the top producing commercial fisheries in the country and is ranked number one in economic impact for its recreational fisheries. Within the state, Miami-Dade is among the top counties for commercial fishing value and landings. In FY 2008-2009, recreational anglers contributed \$5.4 billion to Florida's economy. Since 1964, the recreational fishing fleet in South Florida has grown at a near exponential rate (a 444% increase in recreational boats from 1964 to 1998). This trend continues as recent decades have seen a doubling of recreational vessel registrations in South Florida with no limit on the number of boats allowed to fish.

Each year, tens of thousands of lobster and crab traps are lost during routine fishing, while hurricane years can result in hundreds of thousands of lost traps. Recreational anglers lose countless meters of monofilament line and fishing gear annually. Much of this debris remains in the marine environment and can continue to degrade the natural habitat.

Florida's reefs are considered one of the nation's most stressed ecosystems due to their proximity to dense populations, and the constant threat from hurricanes, diseases, and human-induced impacts. The health of these environments is critical for the health of the marine communities and industries that rely on them. Intense fishing pressure constitutes one of the most significant threats to ecosystem functions.

The Grant Agreement provided by NOAA requires the County Mayor to accept and execute the grant award document. Resolution No. R-613-11 authorizes the County Mayor to conduct County Business, and execute the grant award agreement on behalf of the County.



7.
