

RESOLUTION NO. R-722-11

RESOLUTION URGING THE GOVERNOR, THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE AND THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO REVISIT AND RECONSIDER THE PLANNED CONSTRUCTION OF BICYCLE LANES ALONG S.W. 57 AVENUE/RED ROAD BETWEEN S.W. 8 STREET AND S.W. 40 STREET

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) State Transportation Improvement Program includes several road resurfacing and road improvement projects for S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road, including:

1. S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road from State Road 972/S.W. 24 Street and State Road 90/S.W. 8 Street, Project No. 4227231;
2. S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road from State Road 976/ S.W. 40 Street and State Road 972/S.W. 24 Street, Project No. 4227232; and

**WHEREAS**, these projects include repaving S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road, constructing sidewalks and installing drainage, lighting, new traffic signals, curbs and gutters; and

**WHEREAS**, these projects also include adding bicycle lanes on both sides of S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road, but only along certain segments of the road; and

**WHEREAS**, bicycle lanes will only be constructed where state-owned property is available for such bicycle lanes, and as such there will not be continuous bicycle lanes along S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road; and

**WHEREAS**, the lack of continuous bicycle lanes along S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road presents significant life safety concerns as cyclists would be required to merge into and out of vehicular traffic where the bicycle lanes begin and end; and

**WHEREAS**, residents and business-owners whose properties are adjacent to S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road have voiced concerns at public meetings pertaining to the potential safety of cyclists if these non-continuous bicycle lanes routes are developed; and

**WHEREAS**, S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road also serves as the western border of the planned City of Coral Gables; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1989, the Florida Legislature, pursuant Chapter 89-383, Laws of Florida, designated S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road as a state historic highway and prohibited the use of public funds to alter the dimensions or location of S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road, the median strip thereof, the land adjacent thereto or any part of the original composition of the Coral Gables entranceway, including the towers, walls and lampposts; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2006. the Florida Legislature amended Chapter 89-383 to allow alterations, modifications or improvements to S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road and the adjacent right-of-way for the purpose of enhancing life safety for vehicular or pedestrian use so long as the number of traffic lanes was not altered, Chapter 2007-196, Laws of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, the planned bicycle lanes will cut directly through this state historic road and, in addition to presenting life safety concerns, may alter the historic nature of S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

**Section 1.** Urges the Governor, the Florida Legislature and the Florida Department of Transportation to revisit and reconsider the planned construction of bicycle lanes currently slated for development along S.W. 57 Avenue/Red Road between S.W. 8 Street and S.W. 40 Street

with a particular eye toward life safety concerns related to non-continuous, segmented bicycle paths.

**Section 2.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Florida Senate President, Florida House Speaker, the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation and the Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation.

**Section 3.** Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2011 and 2012 State Legislative Packages.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner **Jose "Pepe" Diaz**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Audrey Edmonson** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
