RESOLUTION NO.	R-936-11

SUPPORTING HJR 169 OR **SIMILAR** RESOLUTION LEGISLATION THAT WOULD **PROPOSE** CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO PROVIDE COUNTIES CITIES A LOCAL OPTION TO GRANT ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION TO LOW INCOME SENIOR CITIZENS IN THE AMOUNT OF THE ENTIRE **HOMESTEAD** PROPERTY; VALUE OF ASSESSED SUPPORTING HB 357 WHICH IMPLEMENTS HJR 169 OR A SIMILAR JOINT RESOLUTION UPON APPROVAL BY STATEWIDE VOTERS

WHEREAS, Representative Jose Oliva (R – Hialeah) has filed House Joint Resolution 169 (HJR 169) for consideration during the 2012 session that would offer significant property tax relief to low income senior citizens; and

WHEREAS, HJR 169 proposes a constitutional amendment to provide counties and cities a local option to grant an additional homestead exemption in the amount of the *entire* assessed value of property to an owner who:

- 1. Has maintained the property as a permanent residence for at least 20 years;
- 2. Is at least age 65; and
- 3. Has a household income not more than \$15,000, with an income escalator for future years; and

WHEREAS, HJR 169 would provide low income senior citizens with additional property tax relief, many of whom are struggling during these difficult economic times; and

WHEREAS, HJR 169 would allow each county and city the local option to decide whether to provide such property tax relief to low income seniors based on the taxes each county and city levies; and

WHEREAS, senior citizens did not see the benefit of a cost of living increase in their Social Security payments for either 2010 or 2011; and

WHEREAS, senior citizens often have higher health care, insurance, and energy costs than their younger counterparts, and retire to lower or often fixed incomes, and have few opportunities to increase their incomes; and

WHEREAS, Representative Oliva also has filed HB 357, which implements HJR 169 or a similar joint resolution upon approval by statewide voters; and

WHEREAS, this Board supports passage of HJR 169, HB 357 or similar legislation that would offer significant property tax relief to low income senior citizens,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Supports HJR 169 or similar legislation that would propose a constitutional amendment to authorize counties and cities a local option to grant an additional homestead exemption to low income senior citizens in the amount of the entire assessed value of the homestead property.

Section 2. Urges the Florida Legislature to pass HJR 169 and its implementing bill, HB 357, or similar legislation.

Section 3. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of the resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, Representative Jose Oliva and the Chair and remaining Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 4. Directs the County's state lobbyists to support the legislation set forth in Sections 1 and 2 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2012 state legislative package to include this item.
