Subject: Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Period Under Existing Non-Competitive Contract

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, their discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTR) set forth in this item. Ordinance #07-139 provides for committee review exemption.

Scope

The impact of the item in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocation and funding source by department/agency is listed in the attached OTR package.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies. Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures as approved in their annual budget adopted by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendor recommended for award. The departments' contract manager is reflected in the attached OTR item.

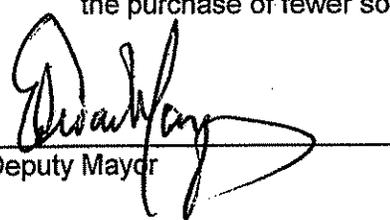
Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise the OTR in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

Background

The non-competitive contract listed in this item requires approval to exercise the OTRs contained in the contract. Prior to exercising any OTR periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Item No. 1: IBM Hardware, Software, Support, and Professional Services seeks authority to exercise the second OTR term for IBM hardware, software, maintenance, support, and professional services. The amount being requested for the second option term is **\$7,961,000**. Additionally, this OTR is approximately \$480,000 less than the current OTR due to decreased utilization, resulting in the purchase of fewer software licenses.

Contract Title: **IBM Hardware, Software, Support, and Professional Services**

Description: It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the second Option-to-Renew (OTR) period available to provide the Information Technology Department (ITD), Clerk of Courts (COC), Internal Services Department (ISD), Community Information and Outreach (CIAO), Police (MDPD), and Aviation (MDAD) departments with the ability to pay for the required acquisition of IBM hardware, software, maintenance, support, and professional services. The contract is in its first OTR, which expires December 31, 2011.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract provides the ITD, COC, ISD, CIAO, Police, and Aviation departments with the ability purchase for required hardware, software, maintenance, support, and professional services provided by International Business Machines Corp (IBM).

The County has relied on IBM software licenses and computer hardware infrastructure for over 35 years to deliver many mission critical enterprise and departmental functions. During this period, many software applications have been developed based on IBM technology. These software applications and systems help bring services to the public, whether directly or indirectly, and also support the internal processes that make service delivery possible. Critical County applications such as the Criminal Justice Information System, Financial Accounting Management Information System, and Advanced Purchasing and Inventory Control System were developed specifically for this platform and continue to be maintained through this contract.

This contract provides IBM's most favored customer pricing equal to that offered to the federal General Services Administration, including any incentives or promotional discounts that may be available, and fixed pricing for maintenance renewals through January 2015. It is therefore in the best interest of the County to exercise the second option-to-renew in order to provide continuity of services for mission critical systems.
