RESOLUTION NO. R-1123-11

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
ENACT HB 973, SB 1270 OR SIMILAR LEGISLATION
ESTABLISHING THE DAN MARINO FOUNDATION
FLORIDA VOCATIONAL COLLEGE

WHEREAS, there are presently over 341,000 students in Florida who have a disability;
and

WHEREAS, seventy-seven percent (77%) of Florida students who have a disability will
currently graduate or age out of the school system without a standard diploma; and

WHEREAS, currently seventy-nine percent (79%) of Florida students who have a
disability will no longer be eligible for further educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, a paltry eight percent (8%) of companies in the United States report hiring
people who have disabilities; and

WHEREAS, this system leaves countless individuals who have disabilities without any
foreseeable employment opportunities or the necessary life and vocational skills to live
independent lives; and

WHEREAS, seventy percent (70%) of students who have a disability tragically do not
believe that they will ever have the means to live independently; and

WHEREAS, this lack of opportunity and supplementary education causes many
individuals with disabilities to be largely dependent on government funding throughout their
entire lives; and

WHEREAS, these facts underscore the significant additional cost—both in money from our taxpayers and in lost opportunities for our communities—that can be incurred when the status quo is perpetuated; and

WHEREAS, a better approach is undeniably necessary and definitively feasible; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has commendably taken up this issue through companion House and Senate bills that have been filed for consideration during the 2012 session, respectively, HB 973 by Representative Jose Felix Diaz (R-Miami) and SB 1270 by Senator Anitere Flores (R-Miami); and

WHEREAS, these companion bills would establish the Dan Marino Foundation Florida Vocational College, a residential school that will provide students who have developmental disabilities, who are 18 to 28 years of age, and who are no longer eligible for exceptional student education funding due to age or graduation from high school with the opportunity to obtain a post secondary education on a college campus setting; and

WHEREAS, passage of these bills would allow eligible students with developmental disabilities to obtain the education and attain the vocational, life, social, and independent living skills that they need and deserve; and

WHEREAS, the Dan Marino Foundation Florida Vocational College would better prepare these students to be an integral part of our community and significantly less dependent on government funding; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to express its support for these bills and such similar legislation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to enact HB 0973, SB 1270, or similar legislation establishing the Dan Marino Foundation Florida Vocational College.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of the resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, Senator Anitere Flores, Representative Jose Felix Diaz and the Chair and remaining members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the issues identified in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2012 state legislative package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz. It was offered by Commissioner **Jose "Pepe" Diaz**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Audrey Edmonson** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
