ORDINANCE NO. 12-13

ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM; AMENDING SECTION 2-8.1.1.1.1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA TO CREATE A CERTIFIED SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE SET-ASIDE FOR CONTRACTS UP TO \$100,000; AND PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN CODE AND EFFECTIVE DATE

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 2-8.1.1.1.1, Code of Miami-Dade County, is hereby amended as follows<sup>1</sup>:

Sec. 2-8.1.1.1.1. Small Business Enterprise Program.

(3) Program.

(b) Contracts of  $[[5]] > \underline{10} < 0.000$  or less.

1. Within the fiscal year, it is required that County departments expend with [[Micro Enterprise]]>>SBE<<s >>one hundred<<[[a minimum of ten]] (10>>0<<) percent of the total value of contracts less than [[fifty]]>>one hundred<< thousand dollars (\$[[5]]>>10<<0,000.00) for goods and/or services. The departmental requirement shall be >>complied with unless SBD determines that there is either not enough capacity, or the contract(s) can only be handled by a non-SBE firm(s)<<[[used as a guideline and shall not be construed as a ceiling for Micro Enterprise participation. Such efforts shall include: Requiring departments whenever possible to solicit bids or quotes from at least four >>(4) <<br/>bidders: 2 certified Micro Enterprises and 2 non-Micro Enterprises]].

(c) Contracts Greater than [[5]] > 10 < 0.000. The following SBE measures may be applied to contracts greater than [[fifty]] > 0000 thousand dollars ([5]] > 10 < 0.000:

Section 2. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 3. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.
