RESOLUTION NO. R-83-12

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
SUPPORT ADEQUATE FUNDING FOR THE WATER
MANAGEMENT DISTRICTS AND OPPOSE
CENTRALIZATION OF COMMAND AND CONTROL OF
REGIONAL AND LOCAL WATER RESOURCES AND ANY
EFFORTS TO PRIVATIZE WATER RESOURCES

WHEREAS, water is vital to our life, health, and well-being, and adequate and properly managed water resources are essential to both our economy and environment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, water management districts were established to manage water on a regional basis, to be overseen by governing boards comprised of lay citizens within the districts and appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Florida Senate; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, strongly discourages the transfer of water resources across water management district boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, recognizes the need for conservation and control of the waters in the State of Florida and treats all waters of the State of Florida as being subject to regulation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the Board:

Section 1. Supports the water management structure and functions as currently set forth in Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, and urges the Florida Legislature not to revise the current water management structure and functions.

Section 2. Supports adequate funding for the water management districts, such that they may accomplish their lawful missions of managing and protecting regional and local water

resources and urges the Florida Legislature to appropriate adequate funding for the water management districts.

Section 3. Opposes the centralization of the command and control of our regional and local water resources within the executive and/or legislative branches of government, or by a statewide board or authority, and urges the Florida Legislature to leave the water management districts intact and not centralized within the executive and/or legislative branches of government or under a statewide board or authority.

Section 4. Opposes any effort to move water from public ownership or control to private interests and urges the Florida Legislature to oppose any such effort.

Section 5. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of the resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker and remaining members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 6. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the issues identified in Sections 1 through 4 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2012 state legislative package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Dennis C. Moss. It was offered by Commissioner **Dennis C. Moss**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Jean Monestime** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
