

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CITY OF MIAMI
CODESIGNATION OF SW 19TH AVENUE FROM SW 1ST
STREET TO NW 1ST STREET AS "ANGEL CALZADILLA
WAY"

WHEREAS, on February 23, 2012 the City Commission of the City of Miami adopted Resolution No. R-12-0057 which designated SW 19th Avenue from SW 1st Street to NW 1st Street as "Angel Calzadilla Way," in recognition of his contributions to the City of Miami, a copy of which is attached and incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, Angel Calzadilla started with the City of Miami Police Department in 1988 and was assigned to uniform patrol in Little Havana; and

WHEREAS, during his 22 years in the force he performed honorably as a patrol officer, and sergeant, hostage negotiator, Public Information Officer and Senior Executive Assistant to two separate Chiefs of Police; and

WHEREAS, Angel Calzadilla was recipient of awards such as several times as Officer of the Month, Rotary Club's Officer of the Year in 1996 and many more; and

WHEREAS, Angel Calzadilla passed away on February 18, 2011 at the early age of 48; and

WHEREAS, SW 19th Avenue from SW 1st Street to NW 1st Street is a city street located in the City of Miami; and

WHEREAS, the City of Miami wants the County to install signage indicating this codesignation on County street signs and traffic signal masts arms; and

WHEREAS, this codesignation is located in County Commission District 5,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Approves the City of Miami codesignation of SW 19th Avenue from SW 1st Street to NW 1st Street as “Angel Calzadilla Way.”

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to send certified copies of this Resolution to the City Manager of the City of Miami, the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department and Land Development/Right-of-Way Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department, the City of Miami Police Department, and the City of Miami Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Bruno A. Barreiro. It was offered by Commissioner **Audrey Edmonson**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Jean Monestime** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MIAMI CITY COMMISSION, WITH ATTACHMENT(S),
CODESIGNATING SOUTHWEST 19TH AVENUE FROM SOUTHWEST 1ST
STREET TO NORTHWEST 1ST STREET, MIAMI, FLORIDA, AS "ANGEL
CALZADILLA WAY;" FURTHER DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO INSTRUCT
THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO TRANSMIT A COPY OF THIS
RESOLUTION TO THE HEREIN DESIGNATED OFFICES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Southwest 19th Avenue from Southwest 1st Street to Northwest 1st Street, Miami, Florida, is codesignated as "Angel Calzadilla Way".

Section 2. The City Manager is directed to instruct the Director of Public Works to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Departments of Police, Fire-Rescue, Solid Waste, Miami-Dade County Public Works, and the United States Postal Service.

Section 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and signature of the Mayor. {1}

Footnotes:

{1} If the Mayor does not sign this Resolution, it shall become effective at the end of ten calendar days from the date it was passed and adopted. If the Mayor vetoes this Resolution, it shall become effective immediately upon override of the veto by the City Commission.
