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## **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) adopt the attached ordinance amending section 2-70 of the Code of Miami-Dade County relating to the Miami-Dade County Office of the Property Appraiser (Property Appraiser), providing authority for the Property Appraiser to enter into third party agreements, without Board Approval, if funds for the agreement are within the Property Appraiser's approved budget.

## **SCOPE**

The scope of this agenda item does not impact any Commission District.

No additional fiscal impact is related to this item.

## **TRACK RECORD/MONITOR**

Agreements entered with third parties are monitored by the Office of the Property Appraiser.



ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 08-62 REGARDING THE OFFICE OF THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER PROVIDING AUTHORITY FOR THE PROPERTY APPRAISER TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS UNDER SPECIFIED CIRCUMSTANCES; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**WHEREAS**, the Property Appraiser’s annual budget is approved each year; and

**WHEREAS**, the budget process allows for the Property Appraiser to include in his submission expenditures for contracts the property appraiser expects to enter into in the next budget year,

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

**Section 1.** Sections 2-70 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, are hereby amended to read as follows:<sup>1</sup>

**Sec. 2-70. Duties and Powers of the Property Appraiser.**

\* \* \*

- (5) The Property Appraiser may enter into agreements with third parties, subject to approval by the Board of County Commissioners. >>Such approval, however, shall not be required if funds for the agreement are within the Property Appraiser’s approved budget. Contracts and purchases by the Property Appraiser shall not require competitive bids when the transaction involves funds within the Property Appraiser’s approved budget.

provided the contract or purchase is made in accordance with the provisions of this section. Contracts and purchases exceeding the Property Appraiser's approved budget may be made by the Board of County Commissioners in accordance with the provisions of the Code. The Property Appraiser shall be authorized to contract for the purchase of goods and services subject only to the requirements of the procurement policy set forth in the implementing order approved by resolution of this Board. <<

\* \* \*

**Section 2.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

**Section 3.** It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.


**Section 4.** This ordinance shall become effective on the later of: (a) ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board; or, (b) the effective date of the resolution approving the implementing order provided for in this ordinance.
