**This item was amended at the June 11, 2012 Recreation and Cultural Affairs Committee meeting. The dollar amount on the first sentence under Fiscal Impact/Funding Source was listed incorrectly. It read "The grant from FRDAP will contribute \$200,000 toward \$1,966,300 estimated project cost". The item should read: "The grant from FRDAP will contribute \$200,000 toward \$2,166,300 estimated project cost".**

### **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached resolution ratifying the September 15, 2011 submittal of a grant application (Exhibit A) to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) for \$200,000 with matching County funds of \$1,700,000 from the Quality Neighborhoods Improvement Program (QNIP) bond fund and \$266,300 from the Building Better Communities General Obligation Bond (BBC-GOB) Program, Project No. 45 - Amelia Earhart Park funds. This resolution further authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to accept and expend funds and execute grant award agreements and other documents as required by the grant upon review and final approval by the County Attorney's Office.

### **Scope**

Amelia Earhart Park is located at 11900 NW 42 Avenue in Commission District 13; however, this item has countywide impact as the park is a regional asset.

### **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The grant from FRDAP will contribute \$200,000 toward the \$2,166,300 estimated project cost. County match funds of \$1,700,000 will come from the Quality Neighborhood Improvement Program capital project 93410300, index code CPE363936075, and \$266,300 will come from BBC-GOB Project No. 45, index code CPF045PR1781. The County's incremental operating cost is estimated to be \$350,000 annually for staffing, lighting and maintenance beginning in FY2014-15, and will be funded from index code PREAME428206. If the grant is not awarded, the project will be deferred.



**Background**

This project is for the construction of two lighted soccer fields, two sets of bleachers, four picnic facilities, an Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible restroom building, an irrigation pump and piping for the soccer fields, two soil mixing areas, parking access control fencing and gates, modification of the existing parking lot to accommodate four ADA parking spaces, and new directional signage.

If awarded, the grant term will be from September 2013 to May 2015. Construction for this project is expected to begin in December 2013. The FRDAP program has awarded almost \$750,000 to MDPROS in the last 10 years.





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## FACTS ABOUT FRDAP

### ***WHAT IS FRDAP AND HOW IS IT ADMINISTERED?***

The Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) is a competitive program which provides grants to local governmental entities for acquisition and development of land for public outdoor recreation use or to construct recreational trails. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Office of Financial Services administers FRDAP. The FRDAP Administrative Rule can be downloaded at [www.dep.state.fl.us/parks/oirs](http://www.dep.state.fl.us/parks/oirs).

### ***WHO MAY APPLY FOR FRDAP FUNDS?***

Municipal and county governments or other legally constituted entities with the legal responsibility to provide public outdoor recreation.

### ***WHAT IS THE GENERAL APPLICATION INFORMATION?***

A proposed FRDAP project must be for one of the three following categories: acquisition of land for public outdoor recreational purposes, development and/or renovation of land for public outdoor recreational purposes, or construction and/or renovation of a public recreational trail. If an **acquisition** project receives a FRDAP grant, the applicant must develop the acquired site for public outdoor recreation use within three (3) years.

### ***HOW DO I APPLY?***

Applicants must submit a completed FRDAP Grant Application during an announced submission period. Applicants may submit up to two applications during the submission period. Each agency may only have a total of three (3) active projects, including any applications being submitted. Applications must involve only one project site except for acquisition or development of salt water beach access. DEP evaluates applications on the basis of the information provided by the applicants, except where such data is superseded by official DEP information. Failure by an applicant to present all required application information and documentation may result in the application being declared ineligible for funding consideration, or may result in a loss of points from the applicant's competitive score. **Application will be evaluated and scored based on the information submitted by the end of the submission period.**

Applicants must submit three copies (1 original and 2 copies) of the completed application and all supporting documents during the announced submission period of **(September 1, 2011, through September 15, 2011)**. **Please use a soft covered binder, no HARD 3-ring binders. To facilitate review and scoring, please tab all exhibits. ANY APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED WITHOUT EXHIBITS BEING TABBED, WILL BE SENT BACK TO THE APPLICANT AND ASKED TO BE TABBED OR WILL BE CONSIDERED INELIGIBLE.** Applications must be postmarked **NO LATER THAN September 15, 2011**, and submitted to:

Based on the scores, DEP prepares and submits a recommended priority list to the Florida Legislature for funding consideration. **The Department's performance and obligation to award program grants is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Florida Legislature. Should the project receive funding, the grantee will have up to three (3) years from the start of the state's fiscal year in which funds are appropriated to complete the project or funds will revert.**



FRDAP funds are requested to provide new construction and facilitate improvements on 17.9 acres of Amelia Earhart Soccer Complex located in Miami Dade County, Florida 80.17.0857W and 25.52.5922N. This Project includes: four new Picnic Areas; two new Lighted Tournament Soccer Fields; two new sets of Bleachers; one new Accessible Restroom Building for Women (6 fixtures/3 sinks) and Men (4 fixtures/3 sinks); one new Irrigation Pump Room; two new soil mixing areas; renovated Parking Access Control; Modification of existing parking lot for four ADA spots; and new directional signage.

North of the proposed project area, the Amelia Earhart Soccer Complex has four Soccer Fields, one Parking Lot and one Field House. Future construction will provide one additional restroom/concession building to serve the four existing fields, four additional fields will be constructed (two Tournament and two practice). A Concession/Storage building and additional parking lot for 80 cars constructed to serve the six fields (Two proposed for this project and four in the future)

Amelia Earhart Park is a regional 515-acre park located at the junction between the municipalities of Hialeah, Opa-Locka, and Miami Lakes. Outside of the project area but located within the park boundary are a variety of amenities and facilities. A 91 acre lake is host to a variety of recreational activities including wakeboarding and wake surfing. Within the one hundred plus acre urban mountain bike trail system there are two archaeological midden sites; five known wetland areas; numerous Florida native trees and plants and a variety of wildlife species. Designated hiking trails will surround the wetland areas and expand public opportunities for bird viewing, natural Florida ecology studies, and observations. The Bill Graham Farm Village provides today's urbanized children an opportunity to learn about Miami-Dade County's agricultural past. The Village includes a replicated farm, Demonstration Shed, Earhart Hall, Crop Area, Beyond the Hall, Smokehouse, Pony Ring, Babbling Brook, Fishing Rock and a County Store. Amelia also has a five-acre Bark Park, Recreation Center, Skate Park, Courts Complex, Picnic Shelters, Disc Golf, Paintball, Volleyball Courts and a future Aquatics Complex.

**County Commission Rules - Rule 6.05 DECORUM**

"Any person making impertinent or slanderous remarks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the commission, shall be barred from further audience before the commission by the presiding officer, unless permission to continue or again address the commission be granted by the majority vote of the commission members present. No clapping, applauding, heckling or verbal outbursts in support or opposition to a speaker or his or her remarks shall be permitted. No signs or placards shall be allowed in the commission chambers. Persons exiting the commission chamber shall do so quietly.

The use of cell phones in the commission chambers is not permitted. Ringers must be set to silent mode to avoid disruption of proceedings. Individuals, including those on the dais, must exit the chambers to answer incoming cell phone calls. County employees may not use cell phone cameras or take digital pictures from their positions on the dais.

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When a resolution or ordinance is placed on the agenda at the request of a commissioner, the commissioner who requested the preparation of the item shall be designated as the prime sponsor. Any other commissioner who wishes to sponsor the resolution or ordinance shall be designated as a co-sponsor.

Pursuant to Rule 5.06(h), where a commissioner is listed as a sponsor, the first named commissioner is the prime sponsor and all other named commissioners are co-sponsors."



The proposed project at Amelia Earhart Park Soccer Complex will further the goals of the *Florida's Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan: Outdoor Recreation in Florida 2008*.

*Outdoor Recreation in Florida- 2008* recognizes the need to assist local government by providing the financial support for meeting their needs for user-oriented recreation. Miami-Dade County Park and Recreation (MDPR) as local government proposes to address the needs at Amelia Earhart by constructing new Tournament Soccer Fields, Picnic areas, Bleachers for their patrons, Restroom facilities, Soil Mixing areas and conduct Parking lot renovations. Amelia Earhart is a regional park located bordered within a congested urban area.

In *Outdoor Recreation in Florida – 2008*, 4-2 states while local governments supply only four percent of the statewide outdoor recreation acreage, they provide two-thirds of the individual parks and recreation areas in the state. As local government, MDPR is tasked with supplying virtually all of the public facilities needed for user-oriented recreation.

The South Florida Region, Table 4.11.1 projects the population in Miami-Dade alone to increase from 2,512,300 million in 2010 to 2,768,300 in the year 2020. This increase of over a quarter million people over the 10-year period, equates to a substantial 10% population growth. Additional recreation facilities and picnic areas must be built to keep with this trend

As evidenced in Table 4.11.2, Municipal and Local government, are the leading providers in the South Florida Region for multi-use fields. In Miami-Dade, there is a shortage of soccer fields available, especially for competition. This project would add two new lighted soccer fields servicing league play, tournaments, camps, and instructional opportunities for all ages.

As that state's most populate region, with a flow of more than twice the visitors, Amelia Earhart Park is strategically located and with funding will be poised to serve the growing demand. Regional diversity and proximity to markets as referenced in Chapter 4 page 83 not only allow competitiveness in the global economy but the addition of the proposed competitive soccer fields through this grant would allow international participation and tournament play.

The development of new picnic areas, lighted soccer fields, bleachers and a restroom facility would increase resident participation. More Outdoor Facilities ranks in the top three reasons cited by residents to encourage greater participation. In addition 49.1% agree that More Organized Activities and Programs would also provide encouragement. Instructional clinics and Recreational League play for young and old will enhance their skills, while Competitive League play will provide an opportunity to host tournaments and competition.

To better address the need as identified in Table 5.3 regarding more information about facilities, The Miami-Dade County Park and Recreation Department (MDPR) provides detailed information about park programs and facilities on the County's website, in *Parklife* magazine, through media press releases collateral marketing pieces and now through social media networks such as Facebook and Twitter. MDPR also works in conjunction with local Youth, Sport, and Community Organizations and partners to share information. MDPR regularly conducts surveys of patrons and tabulates the results for consideration regarding current and future plans. This same use of technology to share information with patrons is referenced in Technology and Outdoor Recreation 6-7.

According to Table 5.5 Demand and Need Summary by Region – Picnicking on page 5-19 the Southwest Region's level of service for years 2010-2020, 3, falls below the state median 6. The level of service is projected in bottom four yet Resource and Facility Requirements regarding needs for that same period is in the top four Regions. The funding in this grant would directly support the addition of picnic areas to address a portion of this tremendous need as evidenced above.

MDPR agrees that public park and recreation agencies should continue efforts to create and promote outdoor recreation activities throughout the state in cooperation with private interest groups, non-profit organization and volunteers. MDPR has partnered with Friends of Amelia and local soccer leagues to provide outstanding soccer program.

All volunteer events at Amelia Earhart Park have incorporated educational components regarding this unique and historically significant location. Friends of Amelia operate an active volunteer program that encourages volunteer participation from all trail users. Participation from community Soccer leagues will enhance recreation at the soccer complex

This proposal addresses needs as recognized in the relative need Table 7.1 2010, and Appendix K for providing picnic areas and soccer fields. MDPR requests funding in order to meet the need of providing special programs and broaden public participation in outdoor recreation. This project will broaden public participation by increasing outdoor recreational opportunities to minorities – attributed to the park's direct proximity to three predominant minority communities. Located within the metropolitan county of Miami-Dade, Amelia Earhart Park borders the Cities of Hialeah, Opa-Locka and Miami-Lakes. Hialeah is the second largest city in the State of Florida and said to be "the only American industrial city that continues to grow" \* With a Hispanic/Latino population comprising an 94.4% (206,426 residents of its total residents) \*\* the city ranks second in the list of U>S> cities where Spanish is most spoken. \* Minority demographics for other bordering cities are as follows: Opa-Locka – 65% (10,670) Black or African American \*\* and 34% (5,598) Hispanic or Latino; and Miami Lakes – 75.6% (16,954) Hispanic or Latino.







### Documentation of ability to Support Programming and Maintenance of Amelia Earhart Park Soccer Complex Project

Our vision is to be a national model for park and recreation systems embracing innovation, professionalism and sustainability while enhancing the quality of life for our community and visitors.

The Miami-Dade County Park and Recreation Department (MDPR) is the third largest county park and recreation system in the United States. With an annual operating budget over 100 million dollars and 1,500 employees, MDPR serves 30 million visitors annually. With 263 parks and 12,848 acres which include such diverse facilities as: Beaches, Marina's; A-toll pools; Golf courses; Parks; Recreation buildings; Trails; Athletic fields; Tracks; Playgrounds; Picnic areas; Dog Parks, Historic buildings, Archaeological sites, Botanical gardens, Nature preserves, Campgrounds, Pools, Greenways, an Equestrian facility, Gun and Archery Shooting ranges; Community centers, Theatres; Auditoriums; world renowned Zoo Miami; Deering Estate of Cutler, and the Crandon Tennis Center home of the Sony Ericsson Open.


The Department continues to receive recognition for excellence. MDPR earned the National Recreation and Park Association Accreditation by the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA). Accredited since 1995, MDPR is one of only 90 agencies nationwide to receive this prestigious award. Parks Director received the 2010 ROSE award while the Department was recognized in 2010 as a NRPA National Gold Medal Finalist and Prior Three time Winner. MDPR received the 2009 Governor's Sterling Award for recognition as a leader in organizational excellence. We are the first park and recreation department in the State of Florida to achieve this distinction. The local chapter of the American Association of Public Administration awarded MDPR its 2009 Outstanding Public Sector Organization Award. In addition, MDPR received the coveted Agency Excellence Award from the Florida Recreation and Park Association. To win the award the Department demonstrated excellence in Parks development and acquisition, recreation programming including inclusion efforts; aquatic, athletic, leisure and cultural arts, fitness and wellness programming, administration and management, cultural diversity, environmental education, programming which benefits the community, long and short range planning, staff training and development and involvement of citizens through advisory boards and volunteer programs.

**Programming:** MDPR has full and part time staff dedicated to programming and operating our facilities. In addition to the onsite staff at Amelia Earhart Park, there are centralized sections that oversee disabled access programs and programs for seniors. There are also personnel who collaborate with local community based organizations such as baseball, soccer and football leagues and partners with providers such as the Miami Dade County Children's Trust, for children's summer camps and after school programs. An array of programs provides opportunities to meet the diversified needs of the community including more than 800 recreation programs yearly. Programs throughout the county include arts and crafts, nature studies, environmental restoration, eco adventures, archaeological excursions, camping, theatre, dance, art expositions, horse shows, exercise programs, cultural arts, special events and instructional and education classes on many subjects ranging from fencing to sea turtle conservation. Out-of-school programs include summer, after-school and sports development programs which service 13,000 school-age children at more than 50 park and recreation facilities.

**Planning, Research and Development:** The Planning Research and Development Division is responsible for acquisitions, development of general plans, and design of specific plans for parks and construction projects. The Division has 33 staff members holding Professional Certifications; 2 Electrical Engineers, 3 Civil Engineers, 2 Mechanical Engineers, 12 Licensed General Contractors, 7 Registered Landscape Architects, 4 Licensed Registered Architects, 3 Engineer interns and 1 Architect in training. Some individuals hold more than one license. Karen Cheney, Licensed Landscape Architect will be overseeing the work on this grant project. It is likely that we will employ an outside firm (through the County bid process) to do the actual work.

**Maintenance:** Park assets are maintained by the Facilities Maintenance Section with a staff of 95 and an annual budget of \$4.2 million. They inspect each site periodically and make repairs or determine the needs and contract for repairs and maintenance. Athletic field and grounds maintenance is provided by onsite park staff and regional roving crews.






Proposed Project Area: Soccer Field, Restroom, Walkway and Bleacher Area



The property hereby conveyed has heretofore been declared surplus to the needs of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, is presently under the jurisdiction of the General Services Administration, is available for disposal and its disposal has been heretofore authorized by the Administrator of General Services, acting pursuant to the above referred to laws, regulations and orders.

IT IS AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD by and between the party of the first part and the party of the second part, and the party of the second part by its acceptance of this Deed, does acknowledge its understanding of the agreement, and does covenant and agree for itself, and its successors and assigns, forever, as follows:

1. The premises above described shall be forever and continuously used and maintained as and for a public park for recreational purposes, as set forth in the above referred to Program of Utilization, submitted to the party of the first part by the party of the second part, which Program of Utilization may be amended from time to time at the request of either the party of the first part or the party of the second part, with the written concurrence of the other party, and that such amendments shall be added to and become a part of the original Program of Utilization.

2. From the date of this conveyance, the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, shall file biennial reports with the Secretary of the Interior, setting forth the use of the property during the preceding two-year period, and other pertinent data establishing its continuous use of the premises for the purposes set forth above;

3. The party of the second part will not sell, lease, assign, or otherwise dispose of, any of the premises above described, except to another local governmental agency that the Secretary of the Interior is satisfied can assure the continued use and maintenance of the property as and for public park for recreational purposes;

4. The party of the first part shall have the right during the existence of any national emergency declared by the President of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, or the Congress thereof, to the full, unrestricted possession, control and use of the premises, or any part thereof, without charge; EXCEPT that the party of the first part shall be responsible during the period of such use, if occurring within a period of twenty (20) years from the date of this conveyance, for the entire cost of maintaining the premises, or any portion thereof, so used, and shall pay a fair rental for the use of any installations or structures which have been added thereto without Federal aid; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that if such use is required after the expiration of a period of twenty (20) years from the date of this conveyance, the party of the first part shall pay a fair rental for the entire portion of the premises so used;

5. In the event of a breach of any condition or covenant herein imposed, the Secretary of the Interior may immediately enter and possess himself of title to the herein-conveyed premises for and on behalf of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA;

6. In the event of a breach of any condition or covenant herein imposed, the party of the second part will, upon demand by the Secretary of the Interior, take such action, including the prosecution of suit, or execute such instruments as may be necessary or required to evidence transfer of title to the herein-conveyed premises to the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA;

7. That, as part of the consideration for this Deed, the party of the second part covenants and agrees for itself, its successors and assigns, that (1) the program for or in connection with which this Deed is made will be conducted in compliance with, and the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, will comply with all requirements imposed by or pursuant to the regulations of the General Services Administration as in effect on the date of this Deed (41 CFR Subpart 101-6.2) issued under the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; (2) this covenant shall be subject in all respects to the provisions of said regulations; (3) the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, will promptly take and continue to take such action as may be necessary to effectuate this covenant; (4) the United States shall have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this covenant, and (5) the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, will (a) obtain from each other person (any legal entity) who, through contractual or other arrangements with the party of the second part, its successors or assigns, is authorized to provide services or benefits under said program, a written agreement pursuant to which such other person shall, with respect to the services or benefits which he is authorized to provide, undertake for himself the same obligations as those imposed upon the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, by this covenant, and (b) furnish the original of such agreement to the Secretary of the Interior, or his successor, upon his request therefor; and that this covenant shall run with the land hereby conveyed, and shall in any event, without regard to technical classification or designation, legal or otherwise, be binding to the fullest extent permitted by law and equity for the benefit of, and in favor of the party of the first part and enforceable by the party of the first part against the party of the second part, its successors and assigns.


