Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew (OTR). The recommended items to be considered by the Board are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Item 1 – Roll-Up Doors, Maintenance and Repair Services: Modifies this contract for an additional 12 months and \$287,000 in spending authority for various County departments to continue purchasing maintenance and repair services for roll-up doors, and incorporate maintenance of various other types of doors, such as overhead and bi-fold bay doors at various County facilities.

Item 2 – Mixed Paper Recycling & Office Document Shredding: Modifies this contract to include an allocation funded by Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) Operating Funds so that MDT can purchase mixed paper recycling and office shredding services. The allocation of \$3,000 is being transferred from existing unallocated funds in the current contract. MDT will use this allocation for shredding services required for proper disposal and destruction of records as set forth by the State of Florida.

Item 3 – Uniform Rental: Modifies this contract to include an allocation of \$141,000 funded by MDT Operating Funds so that MDT can purchase uniform rental and laundry services for employees whose uniforms are soiled with oil and grease due to the nature of their duties.

Item 4 – Rental Linens and Shop Towels: Modifies this contract to include an allocation of \$75,000 funded by MDT Operating Funds so MDT can rent shop towels for the cleaning of tools and equipment.

Item 5 - Polo Shirts: Modifies this contract for an additional 12 months and \$188,000 in spending authority for various County departments to continue purchasing polo shirts for employees that are provided as part of County-issued uniforms.

Item 6 - Bridge Crane & Hoist (Maintenance/Inspection/Repair): Modifies this contract for an additional 12 months and \$173,000 in spending authority for various County departments to continue purchasing bridge crane and hoist services.

Item 7 - Cleaning Blood Borne Pathogens: Modifies this contract for an additional 12 months and \$307,000 in spending authority for various County departments to continue purchasing this specialized sanitation service for cleaning of blood-borne pathogens.

Item 8 - Technology Products & Services: Modifies this contract for additional \$2,997,000 in spending authority for the Miami-Dade Aviation Department to purchase, install, and configure Phase 2 of the Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) system within Miami International Airport (MIA). This project is phase two of a federally-funded surveillance enhancement at MIA. The Transportation Security Administration has provided the funding for Phase 2 of this project, which will include an additional 169 CCTV cameras and peripheral equipment.

This contract modification package is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). This contract modification recommendation may only be considered by the Board if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this contract award recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the filing of this award recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of MDT's allocations from this item. The contracts in this package are scheduled for the June CITT meeting.

Scope

The impact of the items in the attached Competitive Contract Modifications Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocation and funding source, by department, is listed in the attached Competitive Contract Modifications Package. Some contract modifications included in this item include Charter County Transportation Surtax funding.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments/agencies. Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their annual budget adopted by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the Competitive Contract Modifications Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the attached item.

Delegated Authority

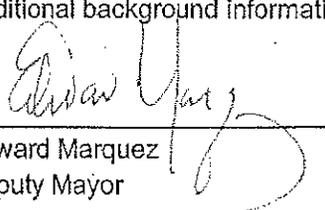

Due Diligence

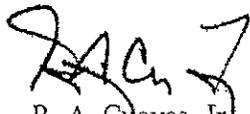

REASON FOR CHANGE

The Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) Department requires uniform rental and laundry services. Due to the nature of the work, some employees' uniforms may become soiled with oil and grease. The vendor launders the soiled uniforms to ensure that contaminated uniforms are not mixed with the employees' household laundry. MDT is obtaining uniform rental services through a separate contract that will expire in October 2012. This action will result in the consolidation of all of the County's uniform rental needs into one contract.

A competitive Invitation to Quote was issued among the two contract vendors. AlSCO, Inc. is the lowest responsive, responsible bidder and is recommended as the primary vendor for MDT. MDT has confirmed that no federal funds will be used for these services.

REASON FOR CHANGE

Authorization is requested for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Aviation Department (MDAD) to purchase, install, and configure the Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) System within Miami International Airport (MIA). The US Communities contract established by Fairfax County was accessed by the County to provide departments with the best value for a range of technology equipment, services, and turnkey solutions. Vendors were pre-qualified to participate in spot market purchases through a competitive Request for Quotes process. The following two groups were established: Group A for technology products and equipment (i.e. workstations, monitors, servers, peripherals, etc.) and Group B for technology services and solutions (i.e. technical services, professional services, financial services/solutions, etc.).

On July 7, 2011, the Board approved use of this contract through resolution No. R-512-11, and ratified Other Transaction Agreement (OTA) No. HSTS04-11-H-CT4001 between Miami-Dade County and the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), providing funding to the County in the amount of \$7,478,218 for the upgrade and design of surveillance capabilities at MIA. The agreement represented TSA's obligation to fund 100 percent of costs to upgrade MIA's existing CCTV System. This will allow design, purchase, installation and integration of approximately 190 new CCTV's along with associated network and recording equipment. This funding will also provide equipment and integration of an event management system.

In January 2012, the TSA modified the OTA to increase funding by \$2,996,848 to cover the design, procurement, installation, and integration along with associated networking and recording equipment for phase two of this project adding an additional 169 CCTV cameras at passenger screening checkpoints, baggage screening areas and throughout the Air Operations Area (AOA) and cargo areas of MIA. MDAD is requesting additional spending authority to cover these purchases to ensure the completion of this second phase using the TSA grant funding.
