Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached competitive contract award and contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew (OTRs). The items are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Section 1 – Competitive Contract Awards

The item included in this section will award a competitive contract to the recommended vendor for the purchase of goods and services.

Item 1.1 – Refuse Transfer Trailers: Awards a contract so that the Public Works and Waste Management Department may purchase refuse transfer trailers. The requested allocation for the five-year contract is \$3,500,000.

Section 2 – Contract Modifications

The items included in this section will modify competitive contracts for additional time and/or spending authority for the purchase of goods and services. The total additional funding requested for the contracts listed in this section is \$2,996,000.

Item 2.1 – Temporary Health Professionals: Modifies this contract for an additional \$135,000 in spending authority to allow Public Housing and Community Development to continue contracting temporary health professionals through the end of the contract term.

Item 2.2 – Private Attorney Services – Public Housing and Community Development: Modifies this contract for an additional \$320,000 in spending authority to process evictions of residents with criminal records.

Item 2.3 – Auditing Services – Public Housing and Community Development: Modifies this contract for an additional \$50,000 in spending authority for the audit of programs previously managed by the former Department of Housing and Community Development. In addition, it is requested that the Board approve the final option-to-renew term available under this contract valued at \$215,000. The total amount requested for the modification and the option-to-renew is \$265,000.

Item 2.4 – Chemical Testing Supplies for Toxicology Laboratory Pre-Qualification: Modifies this contract for an additional 60 months and \$896,000 in spending authority to allow the Medical Examiner and Regulatory and Economic Resources to continue purchasing testing consumables.

Item 2.5 – Plumbing Equipment and Supplies: Modifies this contract for an additional \$1,380,000 in spending authority for the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department to continue purchase of plumbing and equipment supplies through the end of the contract term.

Scope

The impact of the items is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocation and funding source, by department, is listed in the attached items.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in this package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the attached items.

Delegated Authority

If the items in this package are approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew periods and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of each contract.

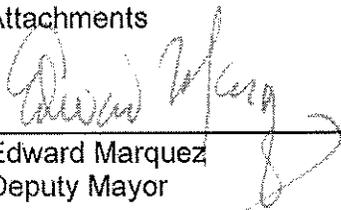
Due Diligence

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF A CERTAIN COMPETITIVE CONTRACT, IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$3,500,000, AND AUTHORIZING MODIFICATIONS OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACTS TOTALING \$2,996,000 FOR PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes:

1. The award of competitive contract for the purchase of goods and services as set forth in item 1.1 of the incorporated memorandum in a total amount up to \$3,500,000.
2. The modification of contracts as set forth in items 2.1 – 2.5 of the incorporated memorandum totaling \$2,996,000 for the purchase of goods and services.

The Board further authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications, options-to-renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

Subject: Recommendation for Award: Refuse Transfer Trailers



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of contract 6326-0/18 Refuse Transfer Trailers to Warren Equipment, Inc. for purchase of transfer trailers. Public Works and Waste Management (PWWM) uses these transfer trailers to transport refuse from various sites throughout the County. Therefore, the trailers must be designed to travel at highway speeds after loading refuse at a transfer station, and on a paved or off-road surface to unload at a landfill dump or similar site.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the total five-year term is \$3,500,000 and is budgeted from PWWM proprietary funds. The previous contract was for two years and was valued at \$6,221,000. The proposed contract amount is based on anticipated needs to purchase up to 50 transfer trailers over the next five years.

Track Record/Monitor

The contract manager for PWWM is Olga Espinosa-Anderson. J. Carlos Plasencia of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications and extensions, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

Contract Description and Reason for Change:

The contract provides for private attorney services used by Public Housing and Community Development in housing eviction actions. Such actions are sometimes necessary to maintain decent, safe and sanitary housing conditions for all residents in public housing and meet our obligations as a landlord.

In 2009, Public Housing and Community Development implemented a policy to conduct criminal background searches on residents to check for violent criminal activities committed in the last ten years. This policy caused an increase in referrals for service beyond the original number of cases projected.

The increase in the additional cases requires additional spending authority for the current contractual year (March 24, 2012 through March 23, 2013) and for the final option to renew year, which will commence on March 24, 2013, both which were originally authorized under R-175-10.

This contract is for the purchase of plumbing equipment and supplies. During the last contract term, staff consolidated four related contracts and their respective awarded vendors into this contract in an effort to eliminate duplication and improve administrative and purchasing functions. Concurrent with the consolidation of these contracts, it was necessary to increase the allocation on the remaining contract, both to accommodate expenditure authority for the consolidated contracts, and to provide for an increased number of projects requiring use of these supplies (R-978-12).
