

RESOLUTION NO. R-174-13

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S  
DESIGNEE TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE QUALITY OF  
THE AIR AND WATER IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY AND  
MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE AIR AND  
WATER QUALITY

**WHEREAS,** ~~[[the area of]]~~<sup>1</sup> Miami-Dade County ~~[[located west of Miami International Airport, east of the Turnpike, south of State Road 836, and north of Kendall]]~~ has experienced a great deal of growth over the years, resulting in a concentration of people, automobiles, and airplanes; and

**WHEREAS,** residents and visitors in Miami-Dade County may be concerned about the effects of such growth on the air quality and water quality of the area; and

**WHEREAS,** Miami-Dade County currently has a number of ambient groundwater monitoring wells and surface water sampling stations located throughout the County, and these samples are used to monitor levels of pollutants in the water; and

**WHEREAS,** Miami-Dade County also currently has a network of air monitors which measure levels of pollutants in the air; and

**WHEREAS,** in addition to these ambient groundwater monitoring wells, surface water stations and the network of air monitors, certain facilities are required to have their own groundwater monitoring wells and conduct their own air quality testing, and this data is submitted to Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, County technical staff can analyze this data [~~[, focusing on the geographic area defined in this Resolution,]] in order to determine if there are matters of concern for air quality and water quality in the area; and~~

**WHEREAS**, even if the data show that pollutant levels are within the allowable federal, state, or local standards, it is possible that the data could reveal increasing trends in levels of certain pollutants that have not yet violated those federal, state, or local standards; and

**WHEREAS**, a report which focuses on water quality and air quality in the geographic area defined above may help address any environmental issues that may affect ~~[[this area of]]~~ Miami-Dade County,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that the Mayor or Mayor's designee is hereby directed to conduct a study on the air quality and water quality of ~~>>Miami-Dade County<<[[the geographic area west of Miami International Airport, east of the Turnpike, south of State Road 836, and north of Kendall]]].~~ Such a study shall include, but not be limited to, an analysis of the data available for this geographic area from ambient groundwater monitoring wells and surface water stations, air monitors, and water quality and air quality data from those facilities that have conducted such testing pursuant to County permits and existing County requirements. The study shall also address whether there are increasing trends in levels of pollutants in this geographic area, even if such levels do not violate federal, state, or local standards, and this study shall include recommendations for improving the quality of the air and water in this geographic area. The Mayor or Mayor's designee shall provide a report on this study and the recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners within six months of the effective date of this Resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Senator Javier D. Souto. It was offered by Commissioner **Lynda Bell**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Esteban L. Bovo, Jr.** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
