## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached competitive contract awards and authorize contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew (OTRs). The items are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

### ***Section 1 – Competitive Contract Award***

The item included in this section will award a competitive contract to the recommended vendors for the purchase of goods and services. The total value of contracts awarded in this section is up to \$2,779,000.

**Item 1.1 – Engine Oil, Lubricant Fluids and Diesel Fuel Analysis:** Awards a contract for purchase of testing and analysis services for various vehicle fluids for Miami-Dade Transit (MDT). The requested allocation for the five-year contract is \$1,259,000.

**Item 1.2 - Cleaning Blood Pathogens/Pathological Waste:** Awards a contract for cleaning services of pathological waste for Miami-Dade Police and MDT, as well as other County departments. The requested allocation for the five-year contract is \$1,520,000.

### ***Section 2 – Contract Modifications***

The items included in this section will modify competitive contracts for additional time and/or spending authority for the purchase of goods and services. The total additional spending authority requested is \$1,526,000.

**Item 2.1 – Rental of Trailers, Trucks, Vans, Utility Vehicles – Prequalification Pool:** Modifies this prequalification pool contract for an additional \$50,000 in spending authority to allow MDT to continue renting trucks and vans.

**Item 2.2 – Coarse Aggregates, Prequalification Pool:** Modifies this prequalification pool contract for an additional \$230,000 in spending authority to allow MDT to purchase asphaltic concrete and ready-mix concrete, which have been consolidated into this contract.

**Item 2.3 – Route Work and Group Travel Services:** Modifies this contract for an additional six months, on a month-to-month basis, and up to \$1,246,000 in spending authority to allow MDT to continue obtaining fixed route bus services for the Dade-Monroe Express and the Card Sound Express.

This contract modifications package is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). These recommendations may only be considered by the Board if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this contract award recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and

45 days have not elapsed since the filing of this award recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of this item. The contracts in this package are scheduled for the March 2013 CITT meeting.

**Scope**

The impact of the items is countywide in nature.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The allocations and funding sources, by department, are listed in the attached items. The items included in this package utilize Charter County Transportation Surtax funding.

**Track Record/Monitor**

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in this package. Each department's contract manager is shown in the attached items.

**Delegated Authority**

If the items in this package are approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew periods and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of each contract.

Items 2.1 and 2.2 are pool contracts with pre-qualified vendors which may participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate contract amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. Additionally, the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board. The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications, options-to-renew, and other extensions in accordance with the terms and conditions of the pool contract.

**Due Diligence**

Due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine Contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and review of performance or compliance issues. The lists referenced include convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Contractor responsibility. This information is provided pursuant to R-187-12.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,779,000.00 AND AUTHORIZING THE MODIFICATION OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACTS FOR PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$1,526,000.00 AND THE USE OF CHARTER COUNTY TRANSPORTATION SURTAX FUNDS FOR SUCH CONTRACT

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that:

**Section 1.** This Board authorizes the award of competitive contracts for the purchase of goods and services as set forth in items 1.1 and 1.2 of the incorporated memorandum in a total amount of up to \$2,779,000.00.

**Section 2.** This Board authorizes the modification of a competitive contract as set forth in items 2.1 – 2.3 of the incorporated memorandum to add an additional \$1,526,000.00 of spending authority for the purchase of goods and services.

**Section 3.** This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise contract modifications, options-to-renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contracts.

**Section 4.** This Board authorizes the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds for the contracts, contract pools and contract modifications set forth herein.

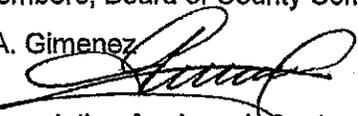

**Subject:** Recommendation for Award: Contract No. 8517-0/18 Engine Oil, Lubricant Fluids and Diesel Fuel Analysis Services



**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of *Contract No. 8517-0/18 Engine Oil, Lubricant Fluids and Diesel Fuel Analysis Services* to two vendors listed below to purchase testing and analysis services for various vehicle fluids such as engine oil, transmission fluid, hydraulic fluid, and diesel fuel used by Miami-Dade Transit (MDT). Fluid analysis services are required to test oils, lubricants, and fuel for potential maintenance problems such as contamination and abnormal wear patterns and to confirm that the quality of products is in compliance with MDT, original equipment manufacturer warranty requirements and industry specifications.

Approval is also requested to allow MDT to use funds as a component of MDT Operating funds for this contract. This award recommendation is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). The MDT allocation within this contract recommendation may only be considered by the Board if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this pool contract recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the filing of this award recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of the MDT allocation from this item.

**Scope**

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The fiscal impact for the total five-year term is \$1,259,000. The proposed contract amount is based on anticipated needs over the next five years. Award value for the past five years was \$918,285. The \$340,000 increase in allocation for the new contract is attributed to estimated quantities of various additional fluids and oils to be tested and analyzed that were not part of the current contract. The allocation is budgeted as follows:

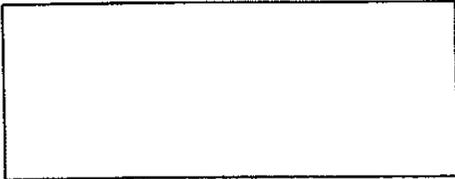

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of Contract No. 6035-0/18 *Cleaning Blood Pathogens/Pathological Waste* to various vendors described further below. This contract provides for cleaning services of pathological waste for Miami-Dade Police Department and Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) as the main users of this contract, as well as other County departments.

Approval is also requested to allow MDT to use funds as a component of MDT Operating funds for this contract. This award recommendation is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). The MDT allocation within this contract recommendation may only be considered by the Board if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this contract recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the filing of this award recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of the MDT allocation from this item.

**Scope**

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The fiscal impact for the total five-year term is \$1,520,000. The previous contract was for 78 months with an allocation of \$2,602,000. The decrease in allocation from the previous contract is primarily attributed to the new pricing structure that will better suit the County's operational needs. The proposed contract amount is based on past usage and anticipated needs over the next five years given the new pricing structure. The allocations are budgeted as follows:

**Delegated Authority**

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications and extensions, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

**Vendors Recommended for Award**

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on October 31, 2012. Award was to the two lowest-priced responsive and responsible vendors on a group-by-group basis, as primary and secondary vendors. Groups 3 and 4 were established specifically for Public Housing and Community Development due to the department's federal funding source. Small Business Enterprise contract measures, User Access Program, and the Local Preference Ordinance do not apply to Groups 3 and 4. However, Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Act applies to these two groups, which includes a bid preference for pre-certified Section 3 business. The groups are as follows:

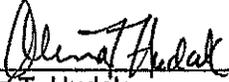

**Contract Description and Reason for Change:**

This prequalification pool contract is for the rental of trailers, trucks, vans, and utility vehicles for various County departments. The Miami-Dade Transit's (MDT's) Bus Division utilizes this contract to rent small trucks and vans when in-house vehicles are out of service. MDT's Finance Division rents trucks and vans for daily fare collection activities at Metrorail stations.

The existing allocation for this first renewal term was prorated. However, the allocation is not sufficient to cover MDT's needs through the end of the term in December 2013. Particularly, MDT continues to require rental of two specialized trucks for daily fare collection, as efforts to procure armored trucks have not been successful. Additionally, the current specialized trucks in the fleet are inoperable. Rental of each truck is \$1,820.58 per month. The balance of the requested funds are for the Bus Division to address needs as they arise. This pre-qualification pool contract will remain advertised on the County's procurement management services website to encourage additional participation, and staff will also notify other vendors enrolled in this commodity code that the pre-qualification pool is available to access. There are four additional renewal terms remaining for this contract.

**Contract Description and Reason for Change:**

This contract is for the purchase of coarse aggregates by various County departments. Staff identified and consolidated two contracts (Asphaltic Concrete and Ready Mix Concrete) with common terms and conditions in an effort to eliminate duplication and improve administrative and purchasing functions. Concurrent with the consolidation of these contracts, it was necessary to increase the allocation on the remaining contract to accommodate expenditure authority for the consolidated contracts. This modification will ensure Miami-Dade Transit has the appropriate allocation through the end of the contract term to ensure uninterrupted supply of coarse aggregates. This pre-qualification pool contract will remain advertised on the County's procurement management services website to encourage additional participation, and staff will also notify other vendors enrolled in this commodity code that the pre-qualification pool is available to access.

**Contract Description and Reason for Change:**

The contract for fixed-route and group travel services operates two fixed bus routes. The first route is the Dade-Monroe Express which offers service between the Super Wal-Mart store in Florida City, Florida City's City Hall, Key Largo, Tavernier, Islamorada, and Marathon. The second is the Card Sound Express which operates between Florida City's City Hall and the Ocean Reef Club. This contract also provides group travel services on an as-needed basis.

A solicitation was issued for the replacement contract which staff is currently negotiating. The new award recommendation will require Board approval, as well as at least a four week transition period. As such, the allocation and additional time requested in this item will ensure service continuity until the successor contract is established. The extension will be on a month-to-month, up to six months, until the successor contractor is in place and ready to run the routes.

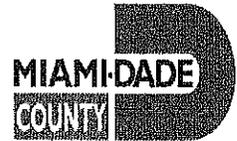
