Subject: Request for Approval to Access the Florida Sheriff's Association Contract for the Purchase of Police Patrol Vehicles for the Miami-Dade Police Department

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve this contract award in the amount of \$2,287,584 to Auto Nation Dodge of Pembroke Pines, Inc. for the purchase of 114 vehicles for the Miami-Dade County Police Department (MDPD). The County will be accessing *Florida Sheriff's Association (FSA) Contract 12-20-0905-MD Utility Vehicles, Trucks, Vans and Other Fleet Equipment* for this one-time purchase. The deadline to place the order for these vehicles and to secure the favorable pricing offered under the FSA Contract is April 30, 2013. As such, waiver of this item directly from April Committee to the next immediate full Board meeting will be requested.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact and Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the total one-time purchase is \$2,287,584. These funds are budgeted in the general fund. The previous contract amount was \$2,645,000 for one-time purchase of 121 police patrol vehicles. That purchase was approved by the Board on April 17, 2012 via Resolution R-348-12.

Due Diligence


Due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues. The lists that were referenced include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to contractor responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two percent User Access Program provision was not included. The County is accessing another entity's contract.
- The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Bid Preference and Local Preference do not apply.
- The Living Wage Ordinance does not apply.

Background

MDPD is requesting access to the Florida Sheriff's Association contract to purchase a total of 114 police patrol vehicles, 78 of which are 2013 Dodge Chargers and 36 are Dodge Avengers. The Dodge Chargers are equipped with the manufacturers' "Police Packages" which include special engines for high speed pursuits, upgraded suspensions, cooling systems, and other enhancements. The Dodge Avengers are mid-sized, 4-cylinder sedans used for investigative purposes (non-pursuit vehicles). Following a detailed review of contract options, FSA contract pricing proved to be the most favorable for these vehicles. The FSA contract was awarded under full and open competition for purchase of various types of pursuit and non-pursuit utility vehicles, trucks, vans and other fleet equipment.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCESS OF FLORIDA SHERIFF'S ASSOCIATION CONTRACT NO. 12-20-0905-MD IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,287,584.00 TO PURCHASE MODEL YEAR 2013 POLICE PATROL VEHICLES, AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO ACCESS THE AGREEMENT FOR AND ON BEHALF OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, AND TO EXERCISE ANY CANCELLATION AND RENEWAL PROVISIONS, AND TO EXERCISE ALL OTHER RIGHTS CONTAINED THEREIN

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board approves the access of Florida Sheriff's Association Contract No. 12-20-0905-MD in the amount of \$2,287,584.00 for the purchase of model year 2013 police patrol vehicles, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to access the agreement for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, and to exercise any cancellation and renewal provisions and all other rights contained therein.
