**Subject:** Resolution Authorizing Establishment of Prequalification Pool, Award of Competitive Contracts, and Competitive Contract Modifications

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve establishment of a pre-qualification pool and authorize contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew (OTRs). The items are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

### ***Section 1 – Establish Prequalification Pools***

The item included in this section will establish a pool of prequalified vendors for future spot market competitions to purchase goods and services. The total spending authority requested is up to \$28,592,000.

**Item 1.1 – Public Safety Vehicles Accessories Pre-qualification Pool:** Approves establishment of a prequalification pool for purchase of public safety vehicle accessories for various County departments. The amount requested for the initial five-year term is \$3,296,000. The cumulative value, if the County exercises the one, five-year OTR, will be up to \$6,592,000.

**Item 1.2 – Paper, Fine Registered Mill Brands Pre-qualification Pool:** Approves establishment of a prequalification pool for purchase of fine registered mill brands, private brands, recovered fiber content paper and related products for the Internal Services Department. The amount requested for the initial five-year term is \$11,000,000. The cumulative value, if the County exercises the one, five-year OTR, will be up to \$22,000,000.

### ***Section 2 – Competitive Contract Awards***

The item included in this section will award a competitive contract to the recommended vendors for the purchase of goods and services.

**Item 2.1 – Laboratory Testing and Sampling Services:** Awards a contract so that the Water and Sewer and the Regulatory and Economic Resources departments can purchase certified laboratory testing and sampling services. The requested allocation for the five-year contract is \$4,335,000.

### ***Section 3 – Contract Modifications***

The items included in this section will modify competitive contracts for additional time and/or spending authority for the purchase of goods and services. The total additional spending authority requested is \$10,257,000.

**Item 3.1 – On-line Arts Grants Application and Management System:** Modifies this competitive contract for an additional 60 months and \$207,000 in spending authority so the Cultural Affairs Department can continue to purchase required maintenance, support, and professional services for the Online Arts Grants Application and Management System.

**Item 3.2 – Diving Services Pre-Qualification Pool:** Modifies this pre-qualification pool contract for an additional 60 months and \$800,000 in spending authority so the Water and Sewer Department can continue to purchase diving services for the installation and inspection of pipes and related equipment.

**Item 3.3 – Mobile Materials Handling Equipment Pre-Qualification Pool:** Modifies this pre-qualification pool contract for an additional \$285,000 in spending authority so the Water and Sewer Department and Miami-Dade Fire Rescue can purchase additional equipment.

**Item 3.4 – Purchase/Maintenance Physical Fitness Apparatus Pre-Qualification Pool:** Modifies this pre-qualification pool contract for an additional 60 months and \$465,000 in spending authority so the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue, Police and Aviation departments may purchase and maintain physical fitness equipment.

**Item 3.5 – Weatherization/Rehab Construction Pre-qualification:** Modifies this pre-qualification competitive contract for an additional 60 months and \$8,500,000 in spending authority so Community Action and Human Services can continue to provide weatherization and rehabilitation services on the homes of low-income elderly residents.

**Scope**

The impact of the items is countywide in nature.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The allocations and funding sources, by department, is listed in the attached items.

**Track Record/Monitor**

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in this package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the attached items.

**Delegated Authority**

If the items in Section 3 of this package are approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent OTR periods and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of each contract.

Upon approval of the items in Section 1, pools of pre-qualified vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate contract amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. Additionally, the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board. The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications, OTRs, and other extensions in accordance with the terms and conditions of the pool contracts.

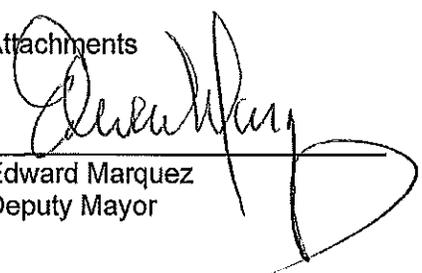

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ESTABLISHMENT OF PRE-QUALIFICATION POOL CONTRACT IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$6,592,000.00, AND AUTHORIZING THE MODIFICATION OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACT FOR PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$10,257,000.00

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:**

Section 1. This Board authorizes the establishment of a pool contract for the purchase of goods and services as set forth in item 1.1 of the incorporated memorandum in a total amount of up to \$6,592,000.00, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to conduct spot bids, award subsequent contracts, and add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the modification of a competitive contracts as set forth in items 2.1 – 2.5 of the incorporated memorandum to add an additional \$10,257,000.00 of spending authority for the purchase of goods and services.

Section 3. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise contract modifications, options-to-renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contracts.

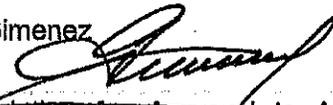

**RECOMMENDATION**

**Subject:** Recommendation for Award: Laboratory Testing and Sampling Services

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of *Contract 5869-0/18 Laboratory Testing and Sampling Services* to various vendors listed below for the purchase of certified laboratory testing and sampling services.

The proposed contract is being established for the Water and Sewer Department (WASD) and the Regulatory and Economic Resources (RER) departments to utilize Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) certified laboratory testing and sampling services to assist Miami-Dade County in meeting and maintaining compliance with federal, state, and local regulations pertaining to water quality.

**Scope**

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

**Fiscal Impact and Funding Source**

The fiscal impact for the total five year term is \$4,335,000. The total allocation on the current contract is \$2,838,000 for six and a half years. The proposed increased amount includes anticipated usage, as well as potential, unforeseen needs as may be mandated by emergencies or federal government agencies. For example, the EPA has four proposed regulations which will be promulgated over the course of this contract. They are the revised Total Coliform Rule, Perchlorate Regulation, Long-Term Lead and Copper Rule Revisions, and Carcinogenic Volatile Organic Contaminants Regulation. These rules will all require additional testing to demonstrate compliance. Also pending is the final outcome of the Consent Decree, which will also include additional testing requirements.

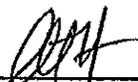
