RESOLUTION NO. R-384-13

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE WEEK COMMENCING
MAY 12, 2013 AND ENDING MAY 18, 2013, AS HAITIAN
FLAG DAY WEEK IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

WHEREAS, during the Haitian revolutionary war, the Congress of Arcahaie convened from May 15-18, 1803, to unite the command of the Haitian revolutionary army under one authority and to adopt a flag; and

WHEREAS, on the last day of the Congress, May 18, 1803, the generals swore an oath of "Liberty or Death" on the adopted blue and red bicolor flag, which was to lead the slaves to victory and freedom; and

WHEREAS, the people of Haiti, including those who have migrated to Miami-Dade County, take a great deal of pride in their nation's flag; and

WHEREAS, there is no greater symbol of their everlasting dedication to an independent Haiti than the flag which represents their triumphs; and

WHEREAS, the descendants of these revolutionaries are so proud of them that students of Haitian backgrounds within the United States dress with the colors of the flag throughout the week of May 18, celebrating when the flag was first created; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Community Advocacy ("OCA"), within the Office of the Chair, works to improve community relations and foster mutual understanding, tolerance and respect among all economic, social, religious and ethnic groups in the County and urges the citizens of the County to join those of Haitian backgrounds as they rejoice in the

accomplishments of their ancestors by memorializing the week of May 12, 2013 to May 18, 2013, as "Haitian Flag Day Week,"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby proclaims the week commencing May 12, 2013 and ending on May 18, 2013 as Haitian Flag Day Week and urges the citizens of the County to join those of Haitian backgrounds in such a significant week in Haitian history.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Chairwoman Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner **Sally A. Heyman**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
