RESOLUTION NO. R-632-13

RESOLUTION URGING PET SHOP OWNERS TO INSTALL A FIRE ALARM SYSTEM OR UPGRADE AN EXISTING STAND ALONE SECURITY MONITORING SYSTEM FOR INCLUSION OF FIRE ALARM SYSTEM TO PROVIDE EARLY WARNING NOTIFICATION OF AN IMMINENT FIRE TO ENHANCE THE SAFETY OF PET STORE ANIMALS

WHEREAS, during the first quarter of 2013, over 30 animals housed in pet stores perished from fires in Miami-Dade County, because the animals were confined in cages and were unable to be removed from the heat and smoke produced by the fire; and

WHEREAS, the applicable edition of the National Fire Protection Association Standard, Life Safety Code 101 Chapter regarding Existing Mercantile Occupancies, does not require all pet shop owners to install a fire alarm system; and

WHEREAS, animals are entitled to kind and respectful treatment and should be afforded a safe environment; and

WHEREAS, stand-alone security systems provide fire and intrusion protection and when monitored, can provide early notification to Police and Fire departments; and

WHEREAS, combined with other elements of an emergency response and evacuation plan, these systems can significantly reduce property damage, personal injuries, and loss of life from fire,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board hereby urges retail pet shop owners to install a monitored fire alarm system or install or upgrade a stand-alone security monitoring system for inclusion of a fire/smoke detection device to provide early warning of an incipient fire; to enhance the safety of pet store animals.

Section 2: This Board directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this Resolution to all retail pet shop owners within Miami-Dade County.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Sally A. Heyman. It was offered by Commissioner **Lynda Bell**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Sally A. Heyman** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
