RESOLUTION NO. R-1002-13

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR DESIGNEE TO
DEVELOP A PLAN FOR THE CREATION OF A LOCAL
ONLINE LOST-AND-FOUND DATABASE AND
SMARTPHONE APPLICATION FOR MISSING PETS WITHIN
THE COUNTY

WHEREAS, animal welfare is an important public policy; and

WHEREAS, facilitating the reunification of lost pets with their owners will reduce the number of wandering and stray animals throughout the County and will serve the public interest; and

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade Animal Services Department currently provides lost-and-found services to the public; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade Animal Services Department uploads photographs of pets that are reported lost or found, on an hourly basis, for nationwide viewing on the website PetHarbor.com; and

WHEREAS, the website PetHarbor.com also currently has a mechanism for the public at large to post photographs and descriptions of lost or found pets; and

WHEREAS, there is currently no local online database that allows residents who have either lost or found pets to make known, specifically on a countywide basis, that their pets have gone missing or that missing pets have been located in the County; and

WHEREAS, creation of a user-friendly countywide local online database for lost-and-found animals, accessible by the public, will facilitate the reunification of lost pets with their owners and will allow for more expedient redemption of such pets throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, such an online database should be created and implemented for the benefit of the County's residents and the welfare of their pets; and

WHEREAS, the online database should, at a minimum:

- allow individuals in the County to quickly and easily submit descriptive details of lost or found pets, upload photos, and provide information on how to be contacted; and
- provide a live link, or other mechanism, that enables municipalities to connect with the County's online database; and
- be prominently featured on the main page of the County's website and on the Miami-Dade Animal Services Department webpage; and
- be actively promoted to residents through the County's website, and/or other feasible means, to ensure substantial public awareness and notice; and

WHEREAS, the database could be known as the "Miami-Dade County Lost-and-Found Pets Online Database"; and

WHEREAS, the online database could be paired and integrated with a smartphone application that would be designed to enable residents to easily and expeditiously report lost-and-found pets remotely from their smartphone devices,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA that the Mayor or designee is hereby directed to develop a plan for the creation of a user-friendly local online database, and smartphone application, for lost-and-found pets, accessible by the public on a countywide basis. The plan should address the costs associated with its implementation. The Mayor or designee shall develop and present such plan to this Board for committee review within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Vice Chair Lynda Bell. It was offered by Commissioner **Lynda Bell**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Esteban L. Bovo, Jr.** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
