RESOLUTION NO. R-142-14

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR DESIGNEE TO  
PROVIDE THE COMMISSION WITH THE NUMBER AND  
PERCENTAGE OF COUNTY EMPLOYEES LIVING OUTSIDE  
MIAMI-DADE COUNTY FROM 2007 TO PRESENT

**WHEREAS**, on November 6, 2007, this Board passed Ordinance No. 07-164 repealing Section 2-11.17 of the Code of Miami-Dade County relating to residency requirements for Miami-Dade County employees; and

**WHEREAS**, employees of Miami-Dade County are no longer required to establish or maintain residency within Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade County employees who reside in Miami-Dade County positively impact the local economy by contributing toward their publicly funded benefits by paying local property taxes; and

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade County has an interest in attracting members of the working class to live and work within Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, an accurate count and percentage of Miami-Dade County employees living outside Miami-Dade County will assist the Board in understanding the current trends concerning the residency of the County's workforce and the potential impact on the local economy,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board directs the Mayor or designee to provide a report to the Board within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this resolution containing the number and percentage of County employees living outside Miami-Dade County for the years 2007 to the present.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Senator Javier D. Souto. It was offered by Commissioner **Sen. Javier D. Souto**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Bruno A. Barreiro** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
