

RESOLUTION NO. R-78-14

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING HB 341 OR SIMILAR  
LEGISLATION THAT WOULD PROHIBIT SMOKING A  
TOBACCO PRODUCT IN A MOTOR VEHICLE IN WHICH  
ANOTHER PERSON WHO IS A MINOR IS PRESENT

**WHEREAS**, Representative Charles McBurney (R - Jacksonville) has filed HB 341 for consideration during the 2014 session that would prohibit smoking a tobacco product in a motor vehicle in which another person who is a minor is present; and

**WHEREAS**, HB 341 would provide that smoking a tobacco product in a motor vehicle when another person who is a minor is present is a nonmoving violation, enforceable as a secondary action after a driver has been pulled over for another offense; and

**WHEREAS**, secondhand smoke is classified as a “known human carcinogen” (cancer-causing agent) by the US Environmental Protection Agency, the US National Toxicology Program, and the International Agency for Research on Cancer, a branch of the World Health Organization; and

**WHEREAS**, in children, secondhand smoke causes respiratory infections, respiratory symptoms, ear infections, and more frequent and severe asthma attacks; and

**WHEREAS**, in the United States, the cost of extra medical care, illness, and death caused by secondhand smoke is estimated to be over \$10 billion per year; and

**WHEREAS**, the levels of pollution from secondhand smoke are more concentrated in confined areas, including motor vehicles,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that this Board:

**Section 1.** Supports HB 341 or similar legislation that would prohibit smoking a tobacco product in a motor vehicle in which another person who is a minor is present.

**Section 2.** Urges the Florida Legislature to enact such legislation.

**Section 3.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, House Speaker, Representative Charles McBurney, and the Chair and members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

**Section 4.** Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the passage of the legislation set forth in Sections 1 and 2 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2014 state legislative package when it is presented to the Board.


