Subject: Resolution Authorizing Award of Competitive Contracts and Additional Expenditure Authority

Agenda Item No. 8(F)(3)

Resolution No. R-326-14

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the award of competitive contracts and authorize additional expenditure authority, with authority to exercise option-to-renew (OTR) periods. The items are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments.

Section 1 – Competitive Contract Awards

The items included in this section will award competitive contracts to the recommended vendors for the purchase of goods and services. The total amount requested for these two contract awards is \$7,797,000.

Item 1.1 – Milk, Other Dairy Products and Fruit Drinks: Awards a contract for the purchase of various types of milk products, cottage cheese and fruit drinks for Community Action and Human Services, Corrections and Rehabilitation, and Public Housing and Community Development departments. The amount requested for the five-year term is \$3,913,000.

Item 1.2 – Uniform Rental Services: Awards a contract for the purchase of uniform rental services for the Aviation, Transit, and Water and Sewer departments. The amount requested is \$3,884,000 for a six-year term.

Section 2 – Additional Expenditure Authority

The items included in this section will increase expenditure authority for various contracts for the purchase of goods and services. The additional expenditure authority is for goods and services allowed under the original terms and conditions of this contract, but for which the funding necessary requires Board authorization. The total additional spending authority requested is \$1,084,000.

Item 2.1 – Financial Advisory Services – Aviation Segment: Extends this contract for an additional six months, on a month-to-month basis, so the Finance Department may continue to utilize consultants to provide financial advisory services for aviation revenue debt transactions and services related to issuance of financing instruments for the County's Aviation Department. The additional amount requested for the six-month extension is \$240,000. Any expenditures related to these services will be covered by bond proceeds dedicated for this purpose.

Item 2.2 – Financial Advisory Services – Enterprise Segment: Extends this contract for an additional six months, on a month-to-month basis, so the Finance Department may continue to utilize consultants to provide revenue debt transaction and services for the County's Enterprise Segment. The additional amount requested for the six-month extension is \$142,000. Any expenditures related to these services will be covered by bond proceeds dedicated for this purpose.

Item 2.3 – Financial Advisory Services – General Segment: Extends this contract for an additional six months, on a month-to-month basis, so the Finance Department may continue to utilize consultants to provide financial advisory services for general and special obligation debt transactions, as well as other financing instruments for the County's General Segment. The additional amount requested for the six-month extension is \$158,000. Any expenditures related to these services will be covered by bond proceeds dedicated for this purpose.

Item 2.4 – Arbitrage Services: Extends this contract for an additional six months, on a month-to-month basis, so the Finance Department may continue to utilize consultants to provide arbitrage rebate calculations and related services for existing and future bond issues. The prorated amount requested for the six-month extension is \$35,000. Any expenditures related to these services will be covered by bond proceeds dedicated for this purpose.

Item 2.5 – Printing of Single Part and Carbonless Fanapart Forms: Extends this contract for an additional six months so the Clerk of the Courts and Public Works and Waste Management departments may continue to purchase carbonless fanapart printed forms. No additional funding is requested for this extension.

Item 2.6 – Electronic Test Equipment and Repair Services – Prequalification Pool: Extends this prequalification pool for an additional five years so various County departments may continue to use this pool to purchase electronic test equipment repair services. The amount requested for the five-year extension is \$509,000.

Item 2.7 – Disaster Debris Removal Monitoring - Prequalification: Extends this pool contract for an additional 12 months so Park, Recreation and Open Spaces, Public Works and Waste Management, and Vizcaya may continue to purchase debris removal monitoring services after a disaster or emergency. No additional funding is requested for this extension.

Scope

The impact of the items is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocations and funding sources, by department, is listed in the attached items.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in this package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the attached items.

Delegated Authority

If the item in Section 1 of this package is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew periods and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of each contract.

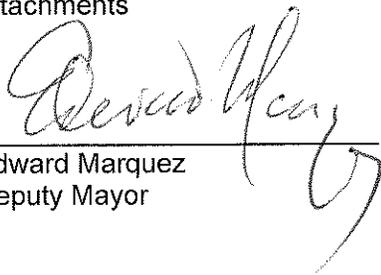

RESOLUTION NO. R-326-14

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACTS FOR PURCHASE OF MILK, DAIRY PRODUCTS, AND FRUIT JUICES AND UNIFORM RENTAL SERVICES IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$7,797,000.00, AND AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$1,084,000.00 FOR FINANCIAL ADVISORY SERVICES, ARBITRAGE SERVICES, PRINTING SERVICES, SERVICES, ELECTRONIC TEST EQUIPMENT SERVICES, AND DISASTER DEBRIS REMOVAL MONITORING SERVICES

WHEREAS, the County Mayor recommends to this Board to authorize additional expenditure authority for the purchase of goods and services,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board authorizes award of competitively established contracts as set forth in items 1.1 and 1.2 of the incorporated memorandum in a total amount up to \$7,797,000.00 for the purchase of milk, dairy products, and fruit juices, and uniform rental services.

Section 2. This Board authorizes additional expenditure authority as set forth in items 2.1 through 2.7 of the incorporated memorandum in an amount up to \$1,084,000.00 for financial advisory services, arbitration services, printing services, electronic test equipment and repair services, and disaster debris removal monitoring services.

Section 3. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise contract

modifications, options-to-renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contracts.

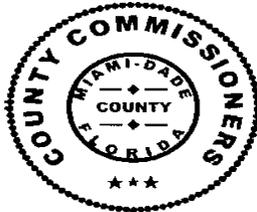

Subject: Recommendation for Award: Milk, Other Dairy Products and Fruit Drinks



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of *Contract No. 0775-0/19, Milk, Other Dairy Products and Fruit Drinks* to the vendor listed below for purchase of various types of milk products, cottage cheese and fruit drinks for multiple County departments. The dairy products must be purchased from processing plants and farms approved by the Florida Department of Health. A current Florida Department of Agriculture Inspection was required as part of the evaluation process.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the total five-year term is \$3,913,000. The current contract, 0775-3/13, is valued at \$5,744,000 for five years and 10 months. The decrease in allocation under the replacement contract is primarily attributable to the exclusion of several items (e.g., yogurt and orange juice) as well as a decline in the requested estimated quantities of the solicited items.

The contract is used by various County departments and the contract manager for each department is listed in the table above. Mike Ramos of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications and extensions in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

Vendor Recommended for Award

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on November 5, 2013. The method of award is to the two lowest-priced responsive and responsible vendors on an item-by-item basis as primary and secondary vendors.

One bid was received in response to the solicitation. Based on the commodity codes selected, notice of the solicitation was sent to 12 enrolled and 36 registered vendors. In an effort to determine why only one bid was received, County staff contacted the vendors that received the solicitation but did not submit a bid. The vendors did not submit a bid for one of the following reasons: (1) unable to provide the types of dairy products requested; or (2) unable to commit to a five-year contract.

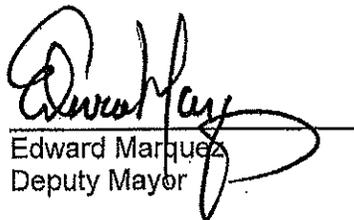

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of *Contract No. 9787-0/20, Uniform Rental Services* to Aramark Uniform & Career Apparel, LLC for uniform rental and laundering services utilized by County departments. Uniform apparel includes long and short-sleeved, high-visibility, flame-resistant shirts, jackets, pants and shorts for workers, painters, and supervisors. The awardee is responsible for picking-up soiled uniforms and delivering laundered uniforms to multiple County sites.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the six-year term is \$3,884,000. This contract consolidates two contracts covering the solicited services: *Contract No. 8740-1/13* valued at \$1,956,000 for five years and six months and *Contract No. 5398-4/12* valued at \$2,518,000 for six years and five months. The proposed monthly allocation is approximately 16 percent lower than that of the current contracts. The decrease is attributed to greater control of monthly usage and reduced pricing.

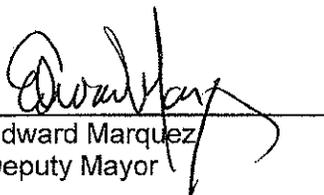

Contract Description and Reason for Change:
 Authorization is requested to modify this contract for additional time and spending authority to allow the Finance Department to continue to utilize BLX Group, LLC, to provide arbitrage rebate calculations and related services for existing and future bond issues that are subject to the Internal Revenue Code and applicable Treasury regulations. Arbitrage is the profit made from investing lower yielding tax-exempt debt proceeds in higher yielding taxable investments. Arbitrage rebate payments are required if the investment yield earned on the gross proceeds of the debt issue are invested above the bond yield. The services the County is requiring include but are not limited to: reviewing all documents pertaining to applicable County tax exempt debt issues and the applicability of Federal tax laws and tax compliance requirements. BLX Group, LLC performs annual arbitrage rebate calculations for each tax-exempt bond issue based on the County's fiscal year for accounting purposes, as well as issue five-year rebate calculations and final rebate analysis ready for submission to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), based on the anniversary of the bonds. The replacement contract for these services is anticipated to be awarded by August 2014. This extension will allow continuity of services until the successor award is approved by the Board.

Contract Description and Reason for Change:
 Authorization is requested to extend this existing pre-qualification pool contract for an additional five years so various County departments can purchase electronic test equipment repair services. Electronic test equipment includes battery testers, torque wrenches, ground resistance testers, and microwave power and analogy meters, among other instruments. Through this pool contract, the vendors are eligible to compete for all work orders issued by the user departments. The value of the five-year extension is \$509,000 based on current and anticipated usage.

This pool offers the County a competitive advantage when purchasing these services. Market research shows the requirements, terms and conditions of the contract will not change if a replacement contract is issued, and it is anticipated that the same vendors will pre-qualify for a replacement solicitation. As such, it is in the best interest of the County to modify the existing pool for an additional five years to allow the user departments to continue accessing this contract.

Qualified vendors may be added to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board. This pre-qualification pool will remain advertised on the County's Procurement Management Services website to encourage additional participation, and staff will also notify other vendors enrolled in this commodity code that the pre-qualification pool is available to access.

Contract Description and Reason for Change:
 Authorization is requested for additional time to allow various County departments to continue purchasing debris removal monitoring services, which are used in the event of a disaster or emergency, in accordance with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) guidelines. This contract provides for debris monitors to support the oversight and management of contractors engaged in debris recovery resulting from hurricanes or other emergencies. Specifically, the selected contractor in this pool will monitor the services performed by contractors on 6417-0/17 Emergency Debris Removal – Prequalification, 9780-0/18 Temporary Debris Staging and Reduction Sites – Prequalification, and 9360-1/23 Hauling and Disposal of Emergency Debris – Prequalification. The monitoring service is required by FEMA in order to be eligible for reimbursement. FEMA, per Stafford Act, will reimburse the County a minimum of 75% of the total expenses, depending on the Declaration of Emergency issued by the Federal government. The State will pay for half of the balance not paid by the Federal government.

This is a prequalification pool to provide for expeditious, competitive selection of a contractor to provide services which include truck certification, damage assessments, training, emergency planning, and preparation of documentation for FEMA reimbursement. Other required services may include facilitating communications with FEMA, the Federal Highway Administration, the State of Florida and other federal agencies and coordination with state insurance representatives. The County normally receives reimbursement from federal and state agencies for most of the expenses incurred for these services.
