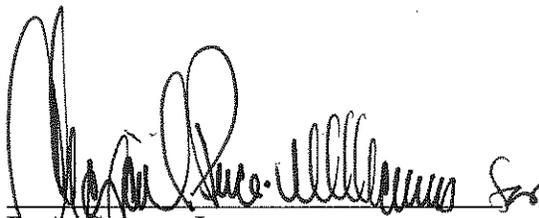

RESOLUTION NO. R-267-14

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING SW 184 STREET/EUREKA DRIVE FROM U.S. 1 TO OLD CUTLER ROAD AS "JOHN F. COSGROVE WAY"; AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. R-1414-93 TO CHANGE THE EASTERN TERMINUS OF THE EXISTING CODESIGNATION OF SW 184 STREET/EUREKA DRIVE AS "BURGER KING WAY" FROM BEING BISCAYNE BAY TO BEING U.S. 1

WHEREAS, on November 20, 2013 the Town Council of the Town of Cutler Bay adopted Resolution No. 13-91 which requested that the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners formally change the existing codesignation of SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive from "Burger King Way" to "John F. Cosgrove Way", in recognition of his contributions as a community leader, public servant and attorney to the Town of Cutler Bay, a copy of which is attached and incorporated by reference, and

WHEREAS, John Francis Cosgrove served in public office for over twenty years, first in the Florida House of Representatives from 1981 to 2000; and

WHEREAS, in 1993, Cosgrove passed legislation keeping private insurers from pulling-out of south Florida after Hurricane Andrew; and

WHEREAS, Cosgrove played a key role in the founding of the Town of Cutler Bay, ultimately being elected as the Town's first mayor; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove's public service extended far beyond his public offices, having been involved in various roles with the National Conference of State Legislatures Commerce & Communications Committee, the National Conference of Insurance Legislators, the Citizens Independent Transportation Trust, the Dade County Public School Legal Program,

the Dade County Economic Development Board, the Dade County industrial Development Board, the City of Miami Budget & Finance Committee, the Private Industry Council, and Jobs for Miami; and

WHEREAS, Cosgrove provided extensive community service through the Knights of Columbus, the Centurion Council, the Emerald Society, the Archdiocese of Miami Catholic Community Services Board, the Junior Orange Bowl Committee, and the South Dade area, Homestead-Florida City, and Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove remained extensively involved with the educational institution that he attended by serving at different times as President of the University of Florida Alumni Association, National Phi Kappa Tau Fraternity, and Cumberland Law School National Alumni Association; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove was an extraordinary individual devoted to family, friends and community; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove passed away on April 19, 2006 during a trip to Africa; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of John F. Cosgrove with the codesignation of SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive from U.S. 1 to Old Cutler Road as "John F. Cosgrove Way"; and

WHEREAS, on November 3, 1993, the then-Dade County Board of County Commissioners adopted Resolution No. R-1414-93, which codesignated SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive from the Homestead Extension of Florida's Turnpike/State Road 821 to Biscayne Bay as "Burger King Way" a copy of which is attached and incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, at that time, Burger King's corporate headquarters were located there, but in 2002, Burger King moved its corporate headquarters to Blue Lagoon Drive; and

WHEREAS, this Board now desires to amend Resolution No. R-1414-93 to change the eastern terminus of the codesignation of SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive as "Burger King Way" from being Biscayne Bay to being U.S. 1; and

WHEREAS, the codesignation of SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive as "Burger King Way" would remain in place from the Homestead Extension of Florida's Turnpike/State Road 821 to U.S. 1; and

WHEREAS, SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive from U.S. 1 to Old Cutler Road is a County maintained road located within the boundaries of the Town of Cutler Bay; and

WHEREAS, Rule 9.02 of the Board's Rules of Procedure provides that resolutions regarding proposed codesignations of Miami-Dade County roads shall be sponsored by the district commissioner where the road is located; and

WHEREAS, this codesignation is located in County Commission District 8,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive from U.S. 1 to Old Cutler Road as "John F. Cosgrove Way".

Section 2. Amends Resolution No. R-1414-93 to change the eastern terminus of the existing codesignation of SW 184 Street/Eureka Drive as "Burger King Way" from being Biscayne Bay to being U.S. 1.

Section 3. Directs the Clerk of the Board to send certified copies of this Resolution to the Mayor and Town Manager of the Town of Cutler Bay, the United States Postal Service, the

Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Town of Cutler Bay Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Vice Chair Lynda Bell. It was offered by Commissioner **Lynda Bell**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **José "Pepe" Diaz** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 13-91

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA, FORMALLY REQUESTING THAT THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS RENAME S.W. 184 STREET TO JOHN F. COSGROVE WAY; PROVIDING FOR AUTHORIZATION FOR THE MANAGER AND/OR DELEGATE TO ADVOCATE FOR SAME; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Cutler Bay (the "Town") desire to honor the life and service of the Honorable John Francis Cosgrove, Esq., a great community leader, public servant, attorney, father, husband, brother, friend and resident; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove served in public office for over twenty years, initially serving in the Florida House of Representatives in District 119 from 1981 to 2000 as a champion for the citizens of Florida, where he was most known for passing legislation in 1993 keeping private insurers from pulling-out of south Florida after Hurricane Andrew; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove played the key role in the founding of the Town of Cutler Bay, ultimately being elected as the Town's first Mayor;

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove's public service extended far beyond his public offices, having been involved in various roles with the National Conference of State Legislatures Commerce & Communications Committee, the National Conference of Insurance Legislators, the Citizens Independent Transportation Trust, the Dade County Public School Legal Program, the Dade County Economic Development Board, the Dade County Industrial Development Board, the City of Miami Budget & Finance Committee, the Private Industry Council, and Jobs for Miami; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove also provided extensive community service to Miami-Dade County through Knights of Columbus, the Centurion Council, the Emerald Society, the Archdiocese of Miami Catholic Community Services Board, the Junior Orange Bowl Committee, and the South Dade Area, Homestead-Florida City, and Greater Miami Chambers of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove remained extensively involved with the educational institution that he attended by serving at different times as President of the University of Florida Alumni Association, National Phi Kappa Tau Fraternity, and Cumberland Law School National Alumni Association; and

WHEREAS, John F. Cosgrove was an extraordinary individual devoted to family, friends and community; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Town Council believe that it is in the best interest of the Town that the legacy of John F. Cosgrove be further memorialized in the community by dedicating S.W. 184th Street in his name.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The above Recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

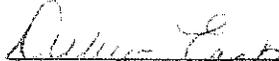

**RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING EUREKA DRIVE FROM THE
HOMESTEAD EXTENSION OF FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE TO
BISCAYNE BAY AS BURGER KING WAY**

WHEREAS, the Burger King Corporation was "born and raised" in Dade County with the opening of store #1 on Coral Way in 1954;

AND WHEREAS, the Burger King Corporation has gained international prominence, having restaurants in all 50 states and 42 countries;

AND WHEREAS, in 1983 the Burger King Corporation considered areas for their World Headquarters including Kansas City, Atlanta and Minneapolis but felt strongly that the Company's roots were in Dade County and here is where its headquarters should stay;

AND WHEREAS, the Burger King Corporation has constructed its Headquarters Complex on Biscayne Bay at Eureka Drive;

AND WHEREAS, as a way of appreciation, the County Commission would like to codesignate Eureka Drive from the Homestead Extension of Florida's Turnpike to Biscayne Bay as Burger King Way.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board approves the codesignation of Eureka Drive from the Homestead Extension of

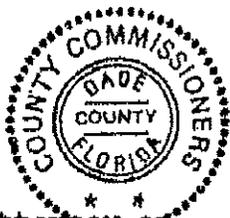
Florida's Turnpike to Biscayne Bay as Burger King Way and the
