

RESOLUTION NO. R-280-14

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING CS/CS/SB 242, CS/HB 151 OR SIMILAR LEGISLATION THAT WOULD AUTHORIZE A REPRESENTATIVE OF A MINOR TO PLACE A SECURITY FREEZE ON THE MINOR'S CONSUMER REPORT TO PROTECT THE MINOR FROM IDENTITY THEFT

WHEREAS, bills have been filed for consideration during the 2014 legislative session, SB 242 by Senator Nancy Detert (R – Venice) and HB 151 by Representative Heather Fitzenhagen (R – Fort Myers), which would establish a process by which a security freeze on a consumer report may be undertaken for a person younger than 16 years of age; and

WHEREAS, Florida has the highest identity theft rate of any state in the country according to the Federal Trade Commission Consumer Sentinel Network Report; and

WHEREAS, the Miami/Ft. Lauderdale/West Palm Beach Metropolitan Area has the highest identity theft rate of any metropolitan area in the country according to the Federal Trade Commission Consumer Sentinel Network Report; and

WHEREAS, children are particularly susceptible to identity theft because thieves target Social Security numbers without a credit history; and

WHEREAS, more than 10 percent of children are victims of identity theft according to a study by AllClear ID; and

WHEREAS, in response to concerns regarding identity theft, Florida, along with 48 other states, has adopted laws that allow a consumer to freeze access to his or her consumer report to prevent anyone from trying to open a new account or new credit; and

WHEREAS, such laws allowing security freezes generally do not protect children from identity theft because statutory security freezes only apply to existing consumer reports, which minors are less likely to have; and

WHEREAS, SB 242 and HB 151 would provide children with a method of protection against identity theft that the rest of the population is afforded,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Supports CS/CS/SB 242, CS/HB 151 or similar legislation that would authorize a representative of a minor to place a security freeze on the minor's consumer report to protect the minor from identity theft.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation, Senator Nancy Detert, and Representative Heather Fitzenhagen.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the passage of the legislation as set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2014 State Legislative Package to include this item and to include this item in the 2015 State Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Vice Chair Lynda Bell. It was offered by Commissioner **Lynda Bell**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **José "Pepe" Diaz** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
