

**Subject:** Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Period Under Existing Non-Competitive Contract

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in their discretion, the Option-to-Renew (OTR) set forth in this item. Ordinance No. 07-139 provides for committee review exemption.

**Item 1 – Tour Andover HVAC – Maintenance System:** Seeks authority to exercise the final one-year OTR term for parts, maintenance and service for the Tour Andover Building Management System at various County facilities. The final OTR term is estimated at \$145,000. Approval of this item will extend the services of Advanced Control Corporation, Inc. for the Tour Andover Building Management System through September 30, 2015.

**Scope**

The impact of the item in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

Contract amount and department allocation represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amounts/values will be expended by these County departments and/or agencies. Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures as approved in their annual budget adopted by the Board.

**Track Record/Monitor**

There are no known performance issues with the vendor recommended for award. The department's contract manager is reflected in the attached OTR package.


**Delegated Authority**

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise the OTR in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract listed in the accompanying package.

**Background**

The non-competitive contract listed in this item require approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract.

Prior to exercising any OTR periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTR for the contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

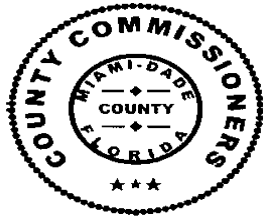

**JUSTIFICATION**

This contract is for purchase of inspection, parts, labor, repair, preventative maintenance, database protection and emergency support services for Tour Andover Building Management Systems. These systems are used by the Miami-Dade Corrections Department Women's Detention Center, and at the Overtown Transit Village North, Overtown Transit Village South buildings managed by the Internal Services Department. These building automation solutions include security, lighting control, heating, ventilating, and air conditioning functions, access card control, temperature control, and digital video surveillance in an integrated system. Advance Control Corporation, Inc. also provides technical support, maintenance, and reporting services. Due to the systems' proprietary nature, Advance Control Corporation, Inc. is the sole authorized representative for Schneider Electric/Tour Andover Controls that can provide the necessary support for this integrated system. It is therefore in the best interest of the County to exercise the last OTR term for continuity of services.
