RESOLUTION NO. R-377-11

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO PERFORM COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENTS FOR THE EARLY HEAD START AND HEAD START PROGRAM EVERY THREE YEARS PER FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS, SPECIFYING REPORTING OF SUCH ASSESSMENTS, AND TO UNDERTAKE ADDITIONAL TASKS REGARDING SUCH PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, 45 C.F.R. § 1305.3, a federal regulation, requires each Early Head Start and Head Start grantee to collect and analyze demographic, education, health, nutrition, and social service need data, as well as information about other available resources, in order to perform a community assessment of eligible children and families within the grantee's service area; and

WHEREAS, 45 C.F.R. § 1305.3 requires each Early Head Start and Head Start grantee to perform such a community assessment once every three years and to update the most recent community assessment each intermittent year with a review of any significant changes; and

WHEREAS, 45 C.F.R. § 1304.51 requires each Head Start and Early Head Start grantee to establish procedures for the ongoing monitoring of Early Head Start and Head Start operations; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County is such a federally recognized grantee; and

WHEREAS, the Early Head Start and Head Start Program is administered by the Miami-Dade Community Action Agency, which has previously performed the community needs assessments; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 09-31 directs the Community Action Agency Board ("CAA Board") to serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the CAA Board has received reports on community needs assessments in the past, on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, a consultant from the University of Western Kentucky has issued a series of reports to CAA regarding the County's Early Head Start and Head Start Program; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is the ultimate governing body of the County's Early Head Start and Head Start Program,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA that the County Mayor or the Mayor's designee shall review the University of Western Kentucky reports and advise the Board of County Commissioners on any beneficial elements from those reports to improve internal controls within the Early Head Start and Head Start Program, perform community needs assessments for the Early Head Start and Head Start Program every three years with intermittent annual updates per federal requirements, provide recommendations on how to improve ongoing monitoring of the Early Head Start and Head Start Program, establish protocol in compliance with applicable federal regulations as to corrective action when program inefficiencies are found, and report on the results to the CAA Board, which will review and advise the Board of County Commissioners regarding the needs for the Early Head Start and Head Start Program; the Board of County Commissioners shall take any official action deemed necessary or appropriate based on the Commission's evaluation of the community needs assessment.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Barbara J. Jordan** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
