Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize the award of a construction contract in the amount of \$9,644,840 to ABC Construction, Inc. (ABC) for construction of the new Joseph Caleb Center Parking Garage at 5400 NW 22 Avenue, Miami, Florida. This project was originally awarded by the County Mayor pursuant to the Economic Stimulus Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.7 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, on March 11, 2014 (Attachment 1). A timely bid protest, the outcome of which is summarized immediately below, was filed on the award.

Bid Protest

Following the evaluation of bids, based on the method of award to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, and verification that the vendor met the responsibility requirements outlined in the solicitation, ABC Construction, Inc. (ABC) was recommended for award on March 11, 2014.

On March 19, 2014, the third-lowest bidder, N&J Construction Corporation (N&J), filed a timely bid protest stating that ABC did "not satisfy the County's requirements identified in the advertisement for bid." A formal protest hearing was held on August 20, 2014. The Hearing Examiner concluded that the evidence showed that the County did not act in an arbitrary or capricious manner in awarding the contract to ABC. The Hearing Examiner further recommended that the award to ABC be upheld, and that N&J's bid protest be denied. A copy of the Findings and Recommendations of the Hearing Examiner are attached hereto (Attachment 2).

Scope

The Joseph Caleb Center, a countywide facility utilized by residents throughout Miami-Dade County, is located in District 3, which is represented by Commissioner Audrey M. Edmonson.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The construction contract for the parking garage is \$9,644,840 and is being funded from the Building Better Communities General Obligation Bond Program Project No. 231, as shown in the Fiscal Year 2014-15 Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan.

Track Record/Monitor

Based on the County's Capital Improvements Information System, there have been 28 evaluations of ABC on prior County contracts. These evaluations reflect an above-satisfactory performance with an average rating of 3.3 out of 4.0. The contract will be monitored by Edgar Lugo from the Internal Services Department's (ISD's) Design and Construction Services Division.

Delegated Authority

The authority of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute and implement this contract is consistent with those authorities granted under Section 2-8.2.7 of the County Code and also includes all authorities specified in the Contract Documents such as Termination of the Contractor for Default or Convenience, and to expend the dedicated allowances identified in Attachment 1 to the item. No additional authority is being requested within the body of this contract.

Background

Upon approval by the Board, it is expected that construction on the parking garage will begin by



December 1, 2014 and be completed in February 2016.

Concurrently, ISD staff has been working closely with stakeholders and tenants of the Joseph Caleb Center to finalize other project elements, including temporary tenant relocations and improvements to the existing tower building in order to renovate four floors and enclose the atrium space. With the Board's recent approval of an amendment to the design consultant's contract, it is expected that the re-design and permitting of the tower renovations will be completed in June 2015. At that time, a solicitation will be advertised to obtain a general contractor to perform the tower renovations.

Overall, it is expected that all construction will be completed and tenants moved back into the newly improved Joseph Caleb Center by the end of 2016.

RECOMMENDATION:

This recommendation for award of Contract ISD No. Z00051-PG between Miami-Dade County and ABC Construction, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$10,482,409 has been prepared by the Internal Services Department (ISD) and is recommended for approval.

Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.7 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, "Economic Stimulus Program" (ESP), the Mayor has delegated authority to award this contract to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder. The contract amount resulting from this contract award recommendation is within 10% of the advertised base estimate.

BACKGROUND:

As one of the more than 300 capital improvement projects funded by the General Obligation Bond (GOB) Program approved by voters, the construction of the Joseph Caleb Center New Parking Garage project is of significant importance to the residents of Commission District 3. This project will replace the existing four-acre surface parking areas on the site of the Joseph Caleb Center with a new, two-story, 324-space parking garage. An additional 164 parking spaces will be created, with enhanced safety and accessibility features for constituents visiting the Joseph Caleb Center.

The Review Committee of ISD's Small Business Development Division met to review the scope of this project on September 5, 2013 and it was determined that 100% of the work would be set aside for a Community Small Business Enterprise; and a Community Workforce Program goal of 25.10% was established in order to achieve the creation of 77 local jobs.

The proposed design is sensitive to the adjacent single-family residential neighborhood by maintaining 25 foot setbacks on the west property line and an 84-foot setback to the north side of the property. The existing south and east property line setbacks will not be altered or affected by this project. The highest elevation of all the newly proposed structures will be 40 feet and 10 inches above grade.

An Invitation to Bid issued under full and open competition advised prospective bidders that a recommendation for award would be conditioned upon the submittal of any and all documents required by the County as part of the bid evaluation process. These include, but are not limited to, the schedule of values and project schedule. Internal Services Department (ISD) staff conducted a detailed responsibility review to assess the contractor's ability to perform this project, and conducted a detailed review of documentation submitted by the lowest bidder, ABC Construction, Inc. (ABC). This included, but was not limited to, the firm's past performance, the capacity of its personnel to perform the services, available business and litigation reports, financial condition, integrity, capability, experience, quality of services provided under other contracts, and the schedule of values to support the proffered bid price. After

Careful consideration and price negotiations, ABC's bid represents the best value for this project, and is therefore recommended for award of this contract.

EXPLANATION: ABC Construction, Inc. (ABC) has been in business for 23 years, and has provided evidence of over 10 years of experience as a general contractor in construction work. Based on references submitted by the selected contractor, as well as on research of County records, the findings were determined to be acceptable for the purposes of meeting the responsibility requirements set forth in the bid documents (copy attached). Twenty-eight (28) evaluations conducted on ABC's performance are available through the County's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS), which reflect ABC's average evaluation score of 3.3 out of a possible 4.0. In addition, County staff further exercised due diligence by obtaining Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) and Public Access to Court Electronic Records (PACER) reports (copy attached) on ABC in order to examine the firm's financial and legal standings, which were determined to be acceptable.

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into on this ____ day of _____, 20____, by and between Miami-Dade County, Florida, acting by and through the Office of The Mayor, party of the first part (hereinafter sometimes called the "County"), and **ABC CONSTRUCTION, INC.**, party of the second part (hereinafter sometimes called "Contractor");

W I T N E S S E T H

That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, mutually agree as follows, to wit:

1. That the Contractor shall furnish all plant, labor, materials and equipment and perform all work in the manner and form provided by the Contract Documents covering the Project of the County known and identified as **Joseph Caleb Center New Parking Garage** for the amount reflected by the Proposal, based on the Contract prices shown in the Proposal heretofore provided by the County, a copy of said Proposal being a part of the Contract Documents, the aggregate amount of this not to exceed **Nine Million Six Hundred and Forty-Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty Dollars (\$9,644,840)**.
2. That the Contractor shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract on a day to be specified in a written order issued by the Engineer, and shall fully complete all work hereunder within the time or times stated within the Contract Documents.
3. That the County shall pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this Contract in lawful money of the United States, and subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the total amount of the aggregate prices for work performed as set forth above at the times and in a manner stated in the General Covenants and Conditions of the Contract Documents.
4. It is further mutually agreed that if at any time after the execution of this Contract and the Performance Bond and Payment Bond, the County shall find the surety upon such bonds to be unsatisfactory, or if for any reason such bond shall become inadequate to cover the performance of the work, the Contractor shall at his own expense, within five (5) days after the receipt of notice from the County to do so, furnish an additional bond or bonds in such form and amount and with such surety or sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the

Contractor shall be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional surety shall have been furnished in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.



Report and Recommendation of Hearing Officer

Preliminary Statement

This matter concerns a Bid Protest filed by Perez-Gurri Corporation, a Florida Corporation, (hereinafter N&J) of Miami-Dade County's (hereinafter the County) recommendation to award contract number Z00051-PG, (hereinafter the Project) to ABC Construction, Inc., (hereinafter ABC), who was determined by the County to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the Project on the grounds that the County arbitrarily and capriciously ignored its own requirements in making the award to ABC. The Project consists of the construction of a new parking garage at the Joseph Caleb Center. The Advertisement For Bids for the Project identified responsibility requirements, the purpose of which is to ensure that the bidders had, or have, sufficient experience as a prime contractor to build the new parking garage. N&J argues, in part, that each bidder was required to demonstrate experience as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one parking garage of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this solicitation, or experience as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one building structure of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this solicitation.

N&J argues that the advertised responsibility requirements were not consistent with those identified in the project manual which thereby caused a subsequent issuance by the County of an Addendum No. 2 revising the responsibility requirements. The revised requirements reflect that the Project had special circumstances which warranted the imposition of additional requirements on the prospective bidders, i.e., the afore-described comparability and complexity requirements.

Three construction companies bid on the project. When the bids were opened on November 22, 2013, ABC, the awarded bidder, had the lowest bid. The second lowest bidder was Lunacon Construction Group, (later determined to be non-compliant). The third lowest bidder was N&J, the Protester herein. On March 11, 2014, the County issued its Notice of Recommendation For Award reflecting that the County intended to award the Project to ABC. On March 14, 2014, N&J timely filed its Notice of Intent to protest the formal bid, resulting in this hearing.

The undersigned Hearing Officer has considered the testimony and exhibits received at the hearing, as well as all documents, exhibits, written submissions, including those of the Intervenor, and awarded bidder, ABC, that were received in this case. Appearing at the hearing on behalf of N&J were Alan Geffin (attorney representing N&J), Michael Perez-Gurri from N&J, Dr. Ron Zolo (a witness for N&J) and Jerry Demarco (witness for N&J). On behalf of the County present were Assistant County Attorney Daniel Frastai and Tara Smith from Division Director for ISD Construction Services. On behalf of ABC was Ira Libanoff (attorney for ABC). Also present were Carol Hayes who was with a witness for N&J and Jorge Gonzalez for ABC.

Although this recommendation does not recite verbatim each and every statement of testimony and evidence provided by the parties, nor witnesses, nor resumé the exhibits presented, the Hearing Officer, nonetheless, has considered the testimony provided, the exhibits in evidence, all submissions, and determined the probative value of each. Part of N&J's protest, is that ABC, in its bid submission, failed to satisfy the responsibility requirements of the County when it identified one of its projects, to wit, the MIA Surface Parking lot at Miami International Airport and several others that it submitted to the County. The County concedes that the submission of the surface parking lot was, in fact, not compliant with the County's requirements,

but argues that the additional submission by ABC, taken in conjunction with all other factors the County considered, was, in fact, in compliance with the County's requirements. Simply put, N&J opines that ABC doesn't have the experience as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one parking garage of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this solicitation, nor experience as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one building structure of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this Solicitation. Further, N&J argues that the County acted arbitrarily and capriciously when it recommended that the project be awarded to ABC in direct conflict with its own requirements as heretofore mentioned. The County argues that ABC did, in fact, meet the responsibility requirements of the County's Solicitation, including the requirement that it previously had constructed a facility, or facilities, as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one parking garage of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this solicitation, or experience as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one building structure of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this solicitation. The County further argues, as does ABC, the Intervenor, that N&J failed to provide any evidence that the County acted arbitrarily, dishonestly or capriciously in awarding the bid to ABC.

Standard of Review

Governmental decisions in the field of competitive procurement are to be given a wide deference. As the Florida Supreme Court stated, in Florida a public body has wide discretion in soliciting and accepting bids for public improvement and its decisions when based on an honest exercise of its discretion, will not be overturned by a court, even if it may appear erroneous, and even if reasonable persons disagree. *Liberity County v. Baxter's Asphalt & Concrete, Inc.*, 421 So. 2d 505, 507 (Fla. 1982) (finding that there was no illegality, fraud, oppression or misconduct

on the part of the government entity, the Court found that it was clearly within the Commission's discretion to award the subject bid). Furthermore, only a showing of clear illegality will entitle an aggrieved bidder to judicial relief. *Dep't of Transp. v. Groves-Watkins Constructors*, 530 So. 2d 912, 913 (Fla. 1988). The scope of review here is limited to whether the purposes of competitive bidding have been subverted. In short, a hearing officer's sole responsibility is to ascertain whether the agency acted fraudulently, arbitrarily, illegally, or dishonestly. In order to challenge an award of a "public contract to an apparent low bidder, appellant is required to establish that it had a "substantial interest" to be determined by the agency. A second lowest bid establishes that substantial interest." *Preston Carroll Company v. Florida Keys Aqueduct Authority*, 400 So.2nd 524, 3rd DCA, 1981.

Findings of Fact

The County issued a request for a price quotation for the construction of the Joseph Caleb Center's new parking garage, ISD Contract No. Z00051-PG, a two-story structure with 324 parking spaces of 152,379 square feet. The advertisement for bids for this project identified Responsibility Requirements, which are mandatory prerequisites for bidders wishing to bid on the project, to ensure that the bidders have sufficient experience as a prime contractor to build the new parking garage. Miami-Dade County's Implementing Order No. 2-13 provides the following definition of responsibility.

Responsibility deals with whether the bidder, or proposer, can perform as provided in the Solicitation. In general, Solicitation requirements for information relating to a bidder or proposer's financial condition, capability, experience and past performance pertain to responsibility. The term, responsible, is not limited in its meaning to financial resources and capabilities, but include a

bidder or prospective proposer's honesty and integrity, skill and business judgment, experience and capacity for carrying out the proposed work, previous conduct under other contracts, and the quality of the previous work performed. The terms of the solicitation document cannot ordinarily change an issue of responsibility into one of responsiveness. A bidder or proposer need not demonstrate compliance with solicitation requirements pertaining to its responsibility in order for its bid or proposal to be deemed responsive and evaluated. Information regarding a bidder or proposer's responsibility may be furnished up to the time of award.

Miami-Dade Implementing Order 2-13 (2011). As stated herein, each bidder was required to demonstrate experience as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one parking garage of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this solicitation, or experience as a prime contractor responsible for the construction of one building structure of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in this solicitation. The bids were opened on November 22, 2013. A total of three construction companies bid on the project. The lowest bidder was ABC, who was awarded the project. The second lowest was Lunacon Group (subsequently found to be non-compliant), and the third lowest bidder was N&J, the Protester herein.

At some point after bidding, the County and ABC met to discuss ABC's qualifications. ABC submitted a list of other projects it engaged in in support of its bid. Ms. Smith, Division Director of Design and Construction Services, testified that said list was just one of many elements that the County utilized in evaluating ABC's responsibility and responsiveness to the bidding process. Thereafter, on March 14, 2014, N&J timely filed its Notice of Intent to Protest the Formal Bid, and timely filed its Protest and Supplemental Protest. N&J has standing to file

this protest. ABC, in its bid submission, identified several of its other projects pending, in progress, or completed, in compliance with the County's responsibility requirement. The County's forms enable a contractor to provide additional information regarding the identified projects that are submitted as being comparable.


While reasonable persons may differ as to whether the list of projects submitted by ABC, and testified to by witnesses in this hearing, more specifically, Ms. Smith, were building constructions of comparable size and complexity and/or parking garages of comparable size and complexity to the facility described in the Solicitation, the County's evaluation of the submissions was not, in fact, arbitrarily and capriciously made. The County acted within its broad discretion in recommending that ABC be awarded the contract. Further, N&J has presented no evidence that the County acted fraudulently, arbitrarily, illegally, or dishonestly. In evaluating the bid submitted by ABC, the Internal Services Department conducted a thorough responsibility review to determine whether or not ABC was a responsible bidder. The Acting Director of the Design and Construction Services Division of the Internal Services Department prepared and issued a Memorandum addressed to the Internal Services Department Director outlining the responsibility review conducted by the department and its conclusions. This responsibility review included a review of ABC's past performance on County projects, capacity of their personnel to perform the services, a due diligence verification, and a report on business and litigation. It also involved a review of the list of projects included in ABC's bid. After completing the evaluation, the Department determined that ABC was a responsible bidder and was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. And, in so doing, the County was acting not only well within the discretion to award the bid to ABC, but, in fact, was required to do so.

N&J's argument that ABC is not responsible in its bid, and that ABC listed several projects that are not in compliance with the County's requirements, is not persuasive.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Based upon the foregoing findings, the Hearing Officer finds that the County did not act in an arbitrary or capricious manner in rejecting the Protester's bid, and in awarding the contract to the recommended bidder, ABC. Therefore, it is recommended by this Hearing Officer that the award for the project be upheld, and that the protest be denied.
