Subject: Request for Additional Expenditure Authority to Contract No. 9159-0/14 Safety Shoes
and Boots Prequalification

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve this request to increase expenditure authority by \$250,000 to *Contract 9159-0/14, Safety Shoes and Boots Prequalification*.

The Water and Sewer Department uses this contract for routine purchase of rubber and hip boots (waders), as well as the annual purchase of safety shoes required per union contracts, the Miami-Dade Safety Manual, and Occupational Safety and Health Administration regulations. The Water and Sewer Department's current allocation is nearly depleted and therefore insufficient to cover operational needs through the end of the contract term. This increased expenditure authority will ensure that the Water and Sewer Department has sufficient funds throughout the remainder of the term.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The contract, which expires on July 31, 2015, has an existing allocation of \$5,350,000 for the 60-month term. Approximately \$4,700,000 has been released to date. This modification will authorize additional expenditure authority in the amount of \$250,000 for the Water and Sewer Department, as the department's original allocation has been depleted and the remaining departmental allocations on the contract are projected for expenditure.

Track Record/Monitor

Each department with an allocation has a contract manager; however, the contract manager for the Water and Sewer Department is Gregory Hicks. Abelin Rodriguez of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contract. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may also add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$250,000.00 FOR CONTRACT 9159-0/14 FOR PURCHASE OF SAFETY SHOES AND BOOTS FOR THE MIAMI-DADE WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENT; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE CONTRACT

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purpose outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board authorizes additional expenditure authority as set forth in the incorporated memorandum in an amount up to \$250,000.00 for contract 9159-0/14 for the purchase of safety shoes and boots.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise all provisions of the contract. A copy of the contract document is on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Services Division.


