RESOLUTION NO. R-81-15

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING SOUTH DADELAND
BOULEVARD AS "HERSCHEL V. 'HANK' GREEN
BOULEVARD"

WHEREAS, Herschel V. "Hank" Green was born in Detroit, Michigan on October 10, 1922 and moved to South Florida after serving in the United States Naval Air Reserve Force as a Lieutenant Junior Grade in World War II; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from the University of Texas in 1947 with a degree in Business Administration, Hank Green founded and was Chairman of The Green Companies, a real estate development company in South Florida; and

WHEREAS, Hank Green was a pioneer in helping to develop the Dadeland area into a vibrant residential, commercial and transportation center, with his development of Dadeland Towers, Dadeland Center, and Datran Center, as well as his joint development with Miami-Dade County of the Dadeland South and North Metrorail Stations; and

WHEREAS, Hank Green was also passionately involved in many local community organizations, serving as Chairman of the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce, Chairman of the Greater Miami Free Trade Zone, Board Member of the Performing Arts Center, President of Royal Palm Tennis Club, and an active member of several other civic organizations; and

WHEREAS, Hank Green was recognized at the local, state and national levels for his significant contributions to the real estate development industry, receiving the Builder of the Year award from both the Builders Association of South Florida and the Florida Builders Association, as well as being inducted into the National Association of Home Builders Hall of Fame, among other recognitions; and

WHEREAS, a visionary real estate developer and community leader, Hank Green passed away on January 14, 2013 at the age of 90; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of Hank Green and his lasting contributions to the Miami-Dade community by codesignating South Dadeland Boulevard as "Herschel V. 'Hank' Green Boulevard"; and

WHEREAS, South Dadeland Boulevard is a short roadway that originates at the intersection of Dadeland Boulevard and SW 90th Lane and runs south-southwest through the heart of southern Dadeland before terminating at SW 98th Street; and

WHEREAS, South Dadeland Boulevard is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 7,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates South Dadeland Boulevard as "Herschel V. 'Hank' Green Boulevard".

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade County Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Xavier L. Suarez. It was offered by Commissioner **Xavier L. Suarez**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Dennis C. Moss** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
