Subject: Recommendation for Approval to Establish a Pre-Qualification Pool: Food and Beverage Products

Resolution No. R-241-15

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the establishment of a pre-qualification pool, *Bid No. RTQ-00112*, for the purchase and delivery of an array of food and beverage products for various County departments. The food and beverage products covered under this pool include, but are not limited to, canned goods, juices, beans, dry goods, spices and condiments. These food and beverage products are used primarily by the Corrections and Rehabilitation Department's food services operations.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the eight-year term is \$19,026,000. The current contract, *6083-0/14*, is for five (5) years and is valued at \$12,030,000. On an annualized basis, the proposed contract is slightly lower in value than the current contract, which is based on user departments' anticipated needs.

Anthony Wells of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

Upon approval of this item, a pool of pre-qualified vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing, and award contracts, up to the aggregate contract amount authorized by the Board. Additionally, the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the contract term, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to exercise, at their discretion any cancellation and renewal provisions, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the pool contract and other rights contained therein.

Vendors Pre-Qualified for Pool

A Request to Qualify (RTQ) was issued under full and open competition on August 20, 2014. Seven (7) vendors responded to the RTQ. The method of award was to pre-qualify all responsive and responsible vendors that met the minimum requirements as specified in the RTQ for participation in future spot market competitions. Additional qualified vendors may be added to the pool during the term of the RTQ. The vendors listed in the following table met the solicitation's pre-qualification criteria.



Due Diligence

Pursuant to Resolution R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues. The lists referenced include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to contractor responsibility.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two (2) percent User Access Program provision applies and will be collected on all purchases where permitted by the funding source.
- The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Bid Preference and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source when SBEs join this prequalification pool. A SBE set-aside also applies, where permitted by the funding source, for spot market competition up to \$100,000 when there are three (3) or more certified SBE firms available.
- The Living Wage Ordinance does not apply.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ESTABLISHMENT OF PREQUALIFICATION POOL RTQ-00112 IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$19,026,000.00 FOR FOOD AND BEVERAGE PRODUCTS AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO CONDUCT SPOT BIDS, AWARD SUBSEQUENT CONTRACTS, ADD VENDORS TO THE POOL AT ANY TIME, SUBJECT TO RATIFICATION BY THE BOARD ON A BI-ANNUAL BASIS, EXECUTE CONTRACTS, AND EXERCISE OPTIONS TO RENEW AND CANCELLATION PROVISIONS, AND ANY OTHER RIGHTS CONTAINED THEREIN

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board authorizes the establishment of prequalification pool Contract No. RTQ-00112 for Food and Beverage Products in a total amount of up to \$19,026,000.00, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to conduct spot bids, award subsequent contracts, and add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis. A copy of the contract document is on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Services Division.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise options-to-

renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contract.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner **Daniella Levine Cava**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
