Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the Mayor's or Mayor's designee's action in applying for a grant from the Health Foundation of South Florida in the amount of \$5,000.00. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds and to provide reports as required in the attached grant award letter.

Scope

The scope is countywide. The funds will be used to promote farmers markets in County parks.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The grant will provide \$5,000.00 to augment the *Miami-Dade & Redland Raised Markets in Parks Nutrition Program* that will promote farmers markets in County parks. No matching funds are required other than the staff time of the Agricultural Manager and current budgeted staff of the Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces (PROS) Department.


Track Record/Monitor

This program is monitored by Charles LaPradd, Agricultural Manager of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, with assistance from PROS.

Background

The purpose of the grant is to promote the consumption of local produce and improve the health and wellness of attendees of farmers markets in County parks. This grant proposes to capitalize on the PROS Department's programs such as *Fit2Play*, which will benefit specialty crop producers and vendors as well as residents. This project will strengthen partnerships among various Miami-Dade County departments and their existing community programs. Project goals are to:

- Educate the public on the importance of nutrition through eating fresh local produce;
- Provide incentives to residents to procure and eat healthy, locally produced crops; and
- Provide producers and vendors with convenient access to educated consumers by establishing farmers markets and County parks.

RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE MAYOR'S OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE'S ACTION IN APPLYING FOR A HEALTH FOUNDATION OF SOUTH FLORIDA GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,000.00 FOR THE MIAMI-DADE & REDLAND RAISED MARKETS IN PARKS NUTRITION PROGRAM; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO RECEIVE AND EXPEND \$5,000.00 IN GRANT FUNDS FROM HEALTH FOUNDATION OF SOUTH FLORIDA
