Subject: Trinity Assistance Group, LLC Application for One Non-Emergency Vehicle

Resolution No. R-222-15

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At the March 11, 2015 meeting of the Transit and Mobility Services Committee, this item was amended on page 2 of the Mayor's Memorandum in the second to the last sentence of the second paragraph to read, "The proposed rates are \$80.00 per round trip..."

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the application of Trinity Assistance Group, LLC for one (1) Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate one (1) non-emergency vehicle.

**Scope**

This Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is countywide, allowing the certificate holder to operate in unincorporated and incorporated areas of Miami-Dade County.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

Licensing, operating permit and inspection fees are collected by the Miami-Dade Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources to support regulatory activities. There is an annual regulatory fee of \$625.00 per certificate that will yield \$625.00 in revenue annually for the new certificate. The County also collects \$38.00 per vehicle inspection with inspection frequency varying with the vehicle age from one (1) to four (4) per year.

**Track Record/Monitor**

The applicant is a new permit holder and is in compliance with all requirements of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Joe Mora, Division Director within the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, will be responsible for monitoring this company.

**Background**

On December 18, 1980, the Board adopted Ordinance 80-145, later codified in Chapter 4, Article III of the Code of Miami-Dade County, providing for the regulation of non-emergency medical transportation. Section 4-44 of the Code provides the procedures to be followed by the County in processing certificate applications. Based upon those requirements, the Board may issue or refuse to issue the certificate as applied for, or may issue the certificate with modifications or upon such terms and conditions as in its judgment the public interest may require. In reaching a determination, the Board shall consider the application, the Mayor's recommendation, all matters presented during the public hearing, and among others, the following criteria:

- (1) The ability of the applicant to provide the proposed service;
- (2) The adequacy of the management plan of the applicant; and
- (3) The benefits that will accrue to the public interest from the proposed service.

Trinity Assistance Group, LLC, located at 3515 Galt Ocean Drive, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33308, seeks to obtain one (1) Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide stretcher non-emergency medical transportation service to individuals requiring this type of transportation.

The applicant seeks to transport patients to and from various medical facilities throughout Miami-Dade County seven (7) days a week, 24 hours a day. Non-emergency transportation rates are not regulated by Miami-Dade County. However, under the Code the Certificate Holder must file their rates with the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources and post them within the passenger compartment section of each vehicle. The proposed rates are \$80.00 per round trip and \$4.25 per mile. The vehicle operated under this certificate will be required to meet the requirements of Section 4-49 of the Code establishing vehicle inspection frequencies.

The management plan submitted by Ms. Inger Lisa Skroder, Manager of Trinity Assistance Group, LLC, includes maintenance, communication, and recordkeeping systems and meets the requirements of the Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted. The proposed service standards meet all requirements of the Code and adequately meet transportation and comfort needs. A background investigation reveals no criminal record within the last five (5) years for the officer(s) of the corporation.

The proposed services to be provided under this certificate will increase the availability of licensed non-emergency medical transportation in Miami-Dade County, thus providing increased competition and high service standards to the public.
