Subject: Resolution Approving Terms of and Authorizing the Mayor, Mayor's Designee, or Miami-Dade County Transit Director to Execute and File Three Grant Applications with the United States Department of Transportation Federal Transit Administration for up to \$85,300,000.00 of Fiscal Year 2015 Section 5307 Urbanized Formula, Section 5337 State of Good Repair Formula, and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula Program Funding

**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize the execution and filing of three (3) grant applications on behalf of Miami-Dade County (County) with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for up to \$85,300,000.00 of Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 Section 5307 Urbanized Formula program, Section 5337 State of Good Repair Formula program, and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula program funding. The total estimated amount includes up to \$55,000,000.00 in Section 5307 Formula, \$24,000,000.00 in Section 5337 State of Good Repair and \$6,300,000.00 in Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities formula program funding.

A public hearing is required in accordance with Federal regulations.

**SCOPE**

These funds will provide support for multiple bus and rail projects, Paratransit services and planning activities. Therefore, the impact of these grants is countywide.

**FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE**

This item represents a positive fiscal impact to the County because it provides funding to Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) and the required local match up to \$21,325,000.00 will be provided in full by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) through the use of State Transportation Development Credits (formerly referred to as toll revenue credits) as a soft match for these grants.

Under Section 1512 of Public Law 112-141 the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21), authorization is continued for state transportation departments to make available to public transit agencies the use of transportation development credits on selected federally assisted public transit capital projects. By using the credits to substitute for the required non-federal share on a new Federal-aid project, the Federal share can effectively be increased to 100 percent.

**TRACK RECORD/MONITOR**

MDT has entered into numerous funding agreements with FTA over the course of 27 years. The Project Manager for these grants is Ed Carson, Grants Resource Manager, MDT Financial Services.

**BACKGROUND**

On July 6, 2012, Public Law 112-141, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (MAP-21) was signed into law. Under MAP-21, several of FTA's programs were repealed, consolidated or changed from a discretionary program to a formula-based program. The current formula programs include the Section 5307 Urbanized Area, 5337 State of Good Repair and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities formula grant programs.

The Section 5307 Formula program makes Federal funding available to urbanized areas for public transportation capital, planning, job access and reverse commute projects as well as the use of certain expenditures by vanpool operators and operating assistance in areas with populations greater than 200,000 operating a maximum of 100 buses in fixed-route service during peak hours (rail fixed guideway excluded). For urbanized areas with populations of 200,000 and more, the formula is based on a combination of bus revenue vehicle miles, bus passenger miles, fixed guideway revenue miles, and fixed guideway route miles, as well as population, population density and number of low-income individuals. The proposed projects expected to be funded up to \$55,000,000.00 under the FY 2015 Section 5307 program for MDT include:

1. capitalization of bus preventative maintenance;
2. Associated Transportation Improvements project (use of 1 percent program allocation required by FTA), such as improvements to South Miami-Dade Busway Shelters, streetscape, bus benches and trash receptacles;
3. Public Transportation Security project (use of 1 percent program allocation required by FTA), such as the purchase and installation of closed circuit televisions for Metrorail;
4. capital planning (general development, comprehensive, short-range transportation);
5. Metrorail and Metromover cable and equipment replacement;
6. Paratransit (Special Transportation Services) using capital cost for contracting; and
7. South Florida Vanpool Program Services.

Projects funded under the Section 5337 State of Good Repair Formula program are limited to replacement and rehabilitation of existing fixed guideway systems or capital projects required to maintain public transportation systems in a state of good repair. Funds are apportioned to urbanized areas with fixed guideway systems in operation for at least seven (7) years and a new modified formula. The proposed MDT projects expected to be funded up to \$24,000,000.00 under the FY 2015 Section 5337 program includes capitalization of rail preventative maintenance.

The Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula program provides funding to replace, rehabilitate and purchase buses and related equipment, construct bus-related facilities and certain expenditures by vanpool operators. The formula is based on population, vehicle revenue miles and passenger miles. The proposed MDT projects expected to be funded up to \$6,300,000.00 under the FY 2015 Section 5339 program includes: Metrobus seat inserts for 225 buses; retrofit of approximately 85 forty-foot buses with new electric engine cooling systems; Central Metrobus depot parking lot resurfacing; and the South Florida Vanpool Services.


Annually, the FTA publishes the apportioned funds appropriated by law for these formula grant programs. The Miami Urbanized Metropolitan Area anticipates receiving up to \$155,150,000.00 in FY 2015 Federal formula funds to be divided among the Urbanized Metropolitan Area (Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach Counties and the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority, SFRTA). The amount of funding each agency receives is based on the apportioned funds, information from the National Transit Database (NTD), and the appropriate formula established by the FTA. The agency Directors within the Urbanized Metropolitan Area mutually agree on the final apportionment to each agency.

The combined formula grant funding (\$85,300,000.00) reflects the estimated maximum amount the County will receive from the FY 2015 appropriation. However, the Highway and Funding Transportation Act of 2014 restricted FTA's budget authority through May 31, 2015. Based on this, the

amount of budget authority available for the period of October 1, 2014 through May 31, 2015 will be prorated due to the Federal Transportation Trust Fund shortfall.

The current appropriation by Congress will only represent two-thirds (8 out of 12 months) of the full amount anticipated for FY 2015. Therefore, MDT will receive up to \$52,000,000.00 for the formula programs in the initial sub-allocation. In order for MDT to receive the remaining funds up to \$33,300,000.00, additional congressional budget authority will be required. MDT as an eligible direct recipient of federal funding will submit separate grant applications to the FTA for each formula program.

These grant applications must be approved by the County no later than May 5, 2015, due to an upcoming grants management system changeover.

RESOLUTION APPROVING TERMS OF AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR, COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE OR MIAMI-DADE TRANSIT DIRECTOR TO EXECUTE AND FILE THREE GRANT APPLICATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION FOR UP TO \$85,300,000.00 OF FISCAL YEAR 2015 SECTION 5307 URBANIZED FORMULA, SECTION 5337 STATE OF GOOD REPAIR FORMULA AND SECTION 5339 BUS AND BUS FACILITIES FORMULA PROGRAM FUNDING AND AUTHORIZING RECEIPT AND EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS PURSUANT TO SUCH APPLICATIONS AND AGREEMENTS AND OF ANY ADDITIONAL FUNDS AS SPECIFIED IN THE AGREEMENTS SHOULD THEY BECOME AVAILABLE

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

**WHEREAS**, a public hearing has been conducted on Miami-Dade County's Section 5307 Urbanized Formula, Section 5337 State of Good Repair Formula and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula grant program applications as described in the County Mayor's accompanying memorandum,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that:

Section 1. Section 5307 Urbanized Formula, Section 5337 State of Good Repair Formula, and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula program funding and provide all necessary supporting documentation.

Section 2. This Board authorizes receipt and expenditure of funds received pursuant to such applications and agreements in the form of the template attached to this resolution and further authorizes receipt and expenditure of any additional funds as specified in the agreements in the form of the template attached to this resolution should they become available.
