Subject: Resolution Approving the First Amendment to the Public Transportation Service Interlocal Agreement Between Miami-Dade County and The Town of Miami Lakes for the Provision of Public Transportation Service

Resolution No. R-494-15

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the execution of the first amendment of the Public Transportation Services Interlocal Agreement (Agreement) between Miami-Dade County (County) and the Town of Miami Lakes (Town) for the purpose of combining two (2) existing routes into one new route re-branded as the Miami Lakes "Moover" Route.

SCOPE

This Agreement has a direct impact on Commissioner Esteban L. Bovo, Jr.'s District 13. However, due to the connection of service with other Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) routes, the impact of this service benefits the public, and is therefore countywide.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the County for this Agreement. The Town is responsible for all operating and maintenance costs of the service and will use its annual Charter County Transportation Surtax proceeds for the operation and maintenance of this service.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

This agenda item is amending the current Agreement. The project manager for this Agreement is Gerald E. Bryan, MDT Section Chief of Transit Service Planning and Scheduling.

BACKGROUND

The Public Transportation Service Interlocal Agreement was approved by the Board on September 4, 2012 (R-706-12). The current Agreement is for five (5) years, with two (2) five-year renewals. The Town is requesting an amendment to the Agreement for the purpose of merging the two (2) prior "East" and "West" routes into one (1) new route which largely mirrors the two (2) prior routes (Exhibit A). The merging of the routes has allowed the Town to dramatically reduce headways, thereby improving service.

Since the route adjustment was implemented on September 1, 2014 and the Town held the public hearing on January 7, 2015 at the Miami-Lakes Town Hall to seek public input regarding this change, the Town is seeking retroactive approval from the County. See the Composite Exhibit to this memorandum, which includes the resolution from the Town, the map route, and the public hearing notice from the Town.

Key provisions of this Amendment include:

- The Miami Lakes "Moover" will no longer operate two (2) routes, but will now operate one (1) new route that will circulate throughout the Town.
- The "Moover" buses will arrive approximately every 25 minutes.

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain the same.

RESOLUTION NO. 14-1236

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA MODIFYING THE ROUTES OF THE MIAMI LAKES MOOVER CIRCULATOR SYSTEM; PROVIDING FOR AUTHORIZATION OF TOWN OFFICIALS; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO THE TOWN CLERK; PROVIDING FOR INCORPORATION OF RECITALS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town of Miami Lakes, Florida ("the Town") operates a free, fixed-route circulator transit service known as the Miami Lakes Moover; and

WHEREAS, the Miami Lakes Moover service currently consists of two routes known as the East Route and the West Route, with a bus operating each route from 6:00 AM to 10:00 AM and 2:15 PM to 7:00 PM on weekdays; and

WHEREAS, the Town has undertaken an analysis to evaluate and improve the routes, taking into account such factors as ridership levels at various locations in the Town, population and job densities, major destinations in the Town and optimizing connections between the Miami Lakes Moover system and Miami-Dade Transit routes; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that combining the two existing Miami Lakes Moover routes into one route, with both circulator buses operating on the route simultaneously, (as shown in Exhibit A attached hereto) will result in improved service by reducing headways and serving areas with the greatest transit potential, including areas that are not well-served by Miami-Dade Transit routes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL FOR THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Modification of Routes. The route shown on the map attached hereto as Exhibit A is hereby established as the Miami Lakes Moover Route.

Section 3. Authorization of Town Officials. The Town Manager and/or his designee are authorized to take all steps necessary to implement the intent of this Resolution including, but not limited to, obtaining Miami-Dade County's approval pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement

between Miami-Dade County and the Town of Miami Lakes for the Provision of Public Transportation Services.

Section 4. Directions to Clerk. The Town Clerk is directed to serve a certified copy of this Resolution upon the Miami-Dade County Mayor or his designee.


Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect September 1, 2014.




Beacon Council honors two Miami Lakes businesses




