## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the award of a non-exclusive professional services agreement by the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

## Multi-Year Capital Plan Project

Item 1 - Recommendation to Award: Professional Engineering Services relating to the Operation and Maintenance of Water and Sewer Department's Water System. The item requests ratification of a non-exclusive professional services agreement in the amount of \$11,000,000 with a total contract term of five (5) years and one (1) five-year option-to-renew to Hazen and Sawyer, P.C.

## Scope

The commission district of the project locations is noted on Exhibit A. The capital projects awarded through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

## Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact and funding source for the project in this item is detailed on Exhibit A and the other accompanying attachments.

## Track Record/Monitoring

WASD's Deputy Director of Capital Improvements and Regulatory Compliance, Juan Carlos Arteaga, AIA, NCARB, will oversee the implementation of this project.

## Background

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD's (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan's Capital Improvements Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

The County entered into the Consent Decree in order to resolve a lawsuit that had been brought in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida (Case No. 1:12-cv-24400-FAM) based on violations caused by the County's deteriorating sewer system.

The accelerated approval process provided through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance reduces the time period to award a contract by approximately 60 days in order to assist WASD in meeting Consent Decree deliverables implementation deadlines and rehabilitation project deadlines and begin work on its Multi-Year Capital Improvements Program projects.

## RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or Mayor's designee approve the attached non-exclusive professional services agreement to Hazen and Sawyer, P.C. for Professional Engineering Services relating to the Operation and Maintenance of WASD's Water System, Project No: E14-WASD-03, Agreement No: 15HASPC001. The total compensation amount is \$11,000,000 with a total contract term of five (5) years and one (1) five (5) year option-to-renew.

## DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

The County Mayor or Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Agreement. The Agreement delegates authority to the County Mayor or Mayor's designee to terminate the Agreement and resolve disputes. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or Mayor's designee has the authority to amend and/or extend the Agreement to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

## PROJECT NAME:

Professional Engineering Services relating to the Operation and Maintenance of Water and Sewer Department's Water System

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The scopes of services are anticipated to include, but are not limited to; the following:

1. Establish water quality goals for the drinking water distribution system, including corrosion and compliance with the Lead and Copper Rule;
2. Review compatibility of water in the distribution system with current treatment of lime softening, reverse osmosis and direct use with chlorination and submit recommendations;
3. Review of system operations to make recommendations for energy conservation and efficiency;
4. Review treatment strategies and provide recommendations for operational modifications, including development and execution of any needed pilot testing;
5. Develop operating procedures and manuals to reasonably ensure consistent high quality drinking water;

6. Develop process monitoring and trending protocols and associated manuals;
7. Conduct training and update system Operation and Maintenance manuals;
8. Assistance in preparing for interaction with regulatory and permitting agencies;
9. Review and/or update Information Management System Program;
10. Coordinate with Geographic Information System (GIS);
11. Review and/or update Water System Asset Management Program;
12. Develop Water Transmission Main Operations, Preventative Maintenance and Assessment/Rehabilitation Program;
13. Develop Water Main Criticality Assessment and Prioritization Program;
14. Develop Water Main Rehabilitation and Replacement Program; and
15. Prepare a vulnerability assessment of water supply facilities to climate change impacts, including sea level rise, ground water level rise, storm surge, wind force, flooding, salt water intrusion, and identify strategies by which to mitigate these consequences.

**TRACK RECORD / MONITOR/ SBD HISTORY OF VIOLATIONS:**

None - Due diligence was conducted by WASD and Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with the ISD Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status and performance and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Hazen and Sawyer, P.C. responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

**EXPLANATION:**

On September 29, 2014, a Notice to Professional Consultants was issued under full and open competition. On October 29, 2014, the Clerk of the Board received two (2) proposals in response to this solicitation. Section 3.3 of the Notice to Professional Consultants states the following: "In the event the County receives fewer than three (3) proposals, or fewer than three (3) proposals are determined to be responsive and responsible to perform the required services, the County may proceed with the number of proposal(s) received which are determined to be responsive and responsible, provided that the County has conducted an analysis of market availability for subject services and determined at its sole discretion that there is no further market availability or immediate interest to provide subject services." In order to determine if there was additional interest, ISD extended the submittal deadline to November 12, 2014. There were no additional proposals received and it was determined that the County should move forward with the two (2) proposals received.

**First-Tier:**

At the First-Tier "Evaluation of Qualifications" meeting held on February 9, 2015, the Competitive Selection Committee reviewed the two (2) proposals received. At this meeting, it was determined that two (2) firms met the minimum qualifications and demonstrated its relevant experience with the project as

required by the Notice to Professional Consultants. The Competitive Selection Committee evaluated and ranked the firms and voted to short-list the two (2) firms.

Second-Tier:

The Second-Tier "Oral Presentations" meeting was held on February 23, 2015. The Competitive Selection Committee ranked Hazen and Sawyer, P.C. as the highest ranking firm (see below) and recommended to negotiate the contract with Hazen and Sawyer, P.C.

The Negotiation Committee was approved by the County Mayor on March 10, 2015. On April 1, 2015, the Negotiation Committee met and concluded negotiations with Hazen and Sawyer, P.C.

The Negotiation Committee also approved a lump sum First Task Service Order (attached as Exhibit B) for a total amount of \$176,070 for a six (6) month period.

Based on the ISD's Capital Improvement Information System database, Hazen and Sawyer, P.C. has eighteen (18) previous evaluations with an average 3.9 rating out of a possible total 4.0 points (attached as Exhibit C).


1. The Prime Consultant must be an engineering firm experienced in all phases of water engineering with particular expertise on the operation and maintenance of water treatment plants and transmission/distribution systems.
2. The Prime Consultant should have at least one (1) successful project in which it has provided such services for a major utility of similar size within the past ten (10) years from the date of solicitation. For utilities at which the Prime Consultant has provided such services, the Consultant shall provide the name and contact information for a Utility Executive with the Utility who can confirm their role. The descriptions shall include the client (i.e., municipality or agency), key project staff, the project name, a summary of the work performed, the contract amount, the schedule (to include start and completion dates), the specific role of the Prime Consultant, the achievements (e.g., programs delivered on schedule, innovative information management systems implemented, new technology utilized), and a client reference and contact information.
3. The Prime Consultant's team should demonstrate their successful experience with assessment, implementation, and integration of information systems, in particular with WASD's enterprise portfolio. The current portfolio includes:
  - ESRI ArcGIS 10 – Geographic Information Systems
  - Infor EAM - Asset Management System
  - Prolance – Project Control and Tracking System
  - PeopleSoft – Enterprise Resource Planning
4. The Prime Consultant's team should also be familiar with developing and implementing ESRI ArcGIS for water/wastewater utilities; be knowledgeable with ESRI geometric networks and automatic GIS integration with hydraulic computer modeling software; and experience collecting utility asset information such as coordinate location Global Position System, and other pertinent measurements.
5. The Prime Consultant shall provide a list of members of the proposed team, identifying the overall Program Manager(s), and the team leaders for key deliverables and the specific role each one of them will perform.
6. The Subconsultants shall have at least one (1) program or project that is relevant to this scope of work within the past ten (10) years from the date of this solicitation specific to their proposed responsibilities. The descriptions shall include the client (i.e., municipality or agency), key project staff, a summary of the work performed, the contract amount, the schedule (to include start and completion dates), the specific role of the Subconsultant, the project's achievements, and client reference and contact information.
7. The expertise must be met by a qualified individual(s) of the Prime Consultant and/or Subconsultants. The experience must be demonstrated by direct or substantial involvement of the individual(s) in a supervisory capacity at the Project Manager level or above. The determination of the individual's qualifications and compliance with the experience and qualifications shall be at the sole discretion of the County. The Competitive Selection Committee may negatively evaluate proposals from firms they determine have failed to meet the above experience and qualification(s).




