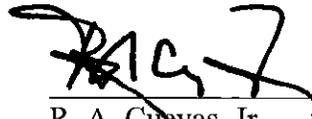

RESOLUTION NO. R-659-15

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE MISSION OF BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF GREATER MIAMI AND ITS EFFORTS TO IMPROVE EDUCATION AND MENTORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE AT-RISK CHILDREN AND YOUTH WHO WILL BE SERVED BY THE BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF GREATER MIAMI CARNIVAL MENTORING CENTER OF EXCELLENCE

WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami is a non-profit organization that seeks to strengthen, develop, and secure our community's future by matching vulnerable at-risk children and youth with committed mentors who invest time, thought, and resources in improving the future for the children and youth participating in the program; and

WHEREAS, the relationship between an at-risk child and a committed adult mentor touches more than just two lives—it creates a better future for Miami-Dade County as a whole by strengthening our local community; and

WHEREAS, according to Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami, independent research shows that children and youth in the program achieve measurably improved outcomes, such as educational success, avoidance of risky behaviors, higher aspirations, greater confidence, and better relationships; and

WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami is seeking to embark on a new project, the Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence, located at 550 N.W. LeJeune Road in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence is expected to have a positive impact on the educational and career paths for the children and youth in the local community; and

WHEREAS, the location of the Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence promotes accessibility for patrons and increased use from area residents, giving Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami the ability to serve the 900 children and youth on its current waiting list; and

WHEREAS, the greater capacity of the Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence will increase the number of vulnerable, at-risk children and youth being served by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami from 2,100 to 5,000 annually; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Community Survey, in 2013 the 5-year average poverty rate for the Census Tract where the Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence is located was 21.5 percent, and the ratio of the median household income of the Tract, when compared to the national median household income, was 59.1 percent; and

WHEREAS, 90 percent of the children and youth served by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami are minorities, and 68 percent live in single-parent households; and

WHEREAS, 83 percent of the children and youth served by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami live in households with an income at or below the poverty level; and

WHEREAS, the new Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence will likely have a positive impact on the lives of the children and youth that reside in the area surrounding the center by providing greater opportunities for mentorship, access to educational and technological resources, and an ability to achieve career goals and aspirations; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to support the mission of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami and its efforts to improve education and mentorship opportunities for the children and youth residing in the area surrounding the Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Supports the mission of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami and its efforts to improve education and mentorship opportunities for the at-risk children and youth who will be served by the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami Carnival Mentoring Center of Excellence.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of this Board to send a certified copy of this resolution to the President and the Chair and members of the Board of Directors of the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Miami.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Audrey M. Edmonson** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
