Resolution No. R-685-15

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached resolution retroactively authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee action in applying for \$1.2 million from the United States Department of Justice Body-Worn Camera Pilot Implementation Program FY 2015 funds to support the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD). The grant period will be effective October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2017. Match funds are required equivalent to the request of 1.2 million.

Scope

The grant will support countywide services.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

This grant will provide \$1.2 million in federal funds to implement the proposed project. The grant requires matching funds in an amount equivalent to this request. Matching funds include: \$1,187,830.00 as a cash match from Police Impact Fees and \$12,170.00 as an in-kind match from MDPD personnel to support training activities. The federal funding source is the United States Department of Justice.

Track Record/Monitor

The grant will be monitored by Gustavo Knoepffler, Chief Financial Officer for the MDPD, to ensure compliance with grant requirements.

Delegation of Authority


The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to receive and expend grant funds and to execute documents such as contracts, agreements and memoranda of understanding, and amendments, as required by program guidelines following review by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency. Also, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to apply for, receive and expend future additional funds should they become available through this grant program, and execute any amendments, modifications, renewals and extension provisions, termination clauses related to the grant applications, contracts, agreements, or memoranda of understanding on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Background

Retroactive ratification of this application is necessary because the proposal did not allow time to submit the resolution to the Board prior to submitting the application. The MDPD grant proposes to implement a body-worn camera program (develop, adopt, train, pilot, implement, and evaluate) within Miami-Dade County to improve transparency and accountability in encounters between police and the public. 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funds will support the procurement and integration of an additional 1,000 body-worn cameras (equipment, warranties, software, licenses, and storage). The grant will also provide for full-time training personnel and a professional evaluation by professors from Florida International University. An important program component is involvement of community partners such as the State Attorney and Public Defender of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit, the Miami-Dade County Community Relations Board, Miami-Dade County Association of Chiefs of Police, Juvenile Justice Advisory Board, and Juvenile Services Department.


WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board ratifies the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee action in applying for United States Department of Justice Byrne Criminal Justice Funds, Body-Worn Camera Pilot Implementation Program FY2015 in the amount of \$1,200,000.00; authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds, and to execute such contracts, agreements and memoranda of understanding, and amendments, as required by program guidelines following review by the County Attorney's Office for form and legal sufficiency; to apply for, receive and expend future additional funds should they become available through this grant program; and to exercise and execute any amendments, modifications, renewals and extension provisions, cancellation and termination clauses related to the grant applications, contracts, agreements, or memoranda of understanding on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.
