RESOLUTION NO. R-1008-15

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S
DESIGNEE TO APPLY TO ROCKEFELLER FOUNDATION'S
100 RESILIENT CITIES PROGRAM AND SEEK THE
SUPPORT OF THE MIAMI FOUNDATION IN APPLYING TO
THE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, pioneered by the Rockefeller Foundation, 100 Resilient Cities supports the adoption and incorporation of resilient cities around the world by helping cities address their physical, social and economic challenges; and

WHEREAS, cities apply to the 100 Resilient Cities Program to obtain help addressing challenges like earthquakes, fires, floods and other natural disasters, as well as high unemployment, an inefficient public transportation system, pervasive violence, and chronic food and water shortages; and

WHEREAS, cities in the 100 Resilient Cities network are provided with the following resources necessary to achieve resilience:

1. financial and logistical guidance for establishing a Chief Resilience Officer, an innovative new position in city government charged with leading the city's resilience efforts;
2. expert support for development of a robust resilience strategy;
3. access to solutions, service providers, and partners from the private, public and non-governmental organization sectors that can help cities develop and implement their resilience strategies; and
4. membership in a global network of member cities that can learn from and help one another; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, in his September 17, 2015 Memorandum on Information for the Second Budget Hearing for Fiscal Year 2015-2016, emphasized his commitment to helping build a resilient community and stated that he would apply to the 100 Resilient Cities Program this year; and

WHEREAS, November 24, 2015 is the application deadline for 100 Resilient Cities Program; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like the Mayor or Mayor's designee to apply to the 100 Resilient Cities Program, with the support and assistance of the Miami Foundation, by November 24, 2015; and

WHEREAS, this Board is confident that the Miami Foundation's support will greatly assist Miami Dade County in applying to the 100 Resilient Cities Program and ultimately becoming a resilient community in both the incorporated and unincorporated areas of Miami-Dade County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the Mayor or Mayor's designee to apply to Rockefeller Foundation's 100 Resilient Cities Program and seek the support of the Miami Foundation in applying to the program.

Section 2. Directs the Mayor or Mayor's designee to provide a report to this Board within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution regarding the application process and submittal, and place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa, and the Co-Sponsors are Commissioner Daniella Levine Cava and Commissioner Audrey M. Edmonson.

It was offered by Commissioner **Barbara J. Jordan**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Xavier L. Suarez** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


