

RESOLUTION NO. R-1042-15

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING H.R. 3761 OR SIMILAR
LEGISLATION THAT WOULD INCREASE SOCIAL
SECURITY AND MILITARY RETIREMENT BENEFITS AND
TIE FUTURE COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENTS TO THE
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR THE ELDERLY

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2015, the Social Security Administration (SSA) announced that it will not be implementing a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for Social Security in 2016; and

WHEREAS, this will mark only the third time that seniors have not received an increase in their Social Security benefits since automatic COLAs were enacted by Congress in 1975, with the other two times occurring in 2010 and 2011; and

WHEREAS, two-thirds of our nation's seniors rely on earned Social Security benefits for a majority of their income; and

WHEREAS, currently, SSA determines the COLA by tracking inflation through the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers, or CPI-W, which measures price changes in basic goods and services, such as food, housing, clothing, transportation, energy, medical care, recreation and education; and

WHEREAS, the current method of determining COLAs does not take into consideration that retirees have different spending patterns than urban wage earners; and

WHEREAS, the disparity is highlighted this year, given that the CPI-W fell in large part due to the decrease in gasoline prices, which retirees tend to consume in lesser amounts; and

WHEREAS, further, seniors spend more on health care than do younger workers, and medical care prices are rising faster than are prices of other goods; and

WHEREAS, on October 16, 2015, U.S. Representative Alan Grayson (D – Florida) introduced the Seniors Deserve a Raise Act, H.R. 3761 for consideration by the 114th Congress; and

WHEREAS, under H.R. 3761, future COLAs would be calculated based on the Consumer Price Index for the Elderly, or CPI-E, a formula based on the price of items that seniors tend to buy, such as prescription drugs and medical expenses; and

WHEREAS, additionally, H.R. 3761 would increase retirees benefits by 2.9 percent in 2016; and

WHEREAS, passage of this bill would assist the many seniors who depend on Social Security for basic necessities,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Supports H.R. 3761 or similar legislation that would increase Social Security and military retirement benefits and tie future cost-of-living adjustments to the Consumer Price Index for the elderly.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to U.S. Representative Alan Grayson and the remaining members of the Florida Congressional Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the passage of legislation as set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2016 Federal Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Daniella Levine Cava.

It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Dennis C. Moss** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
