RESOLUTION NO. R-290-16

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO INVESTIGATE AND IF APPROPRIATE PREPARE A REPORT REGARDING THE FEASIBILITY AND COST OF UPGRADING THE STREET LIGHTING SYSTEMS SERVING THE LIBERTY HOMES STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENT SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT

WHEREAS, on October 16, 1973, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-1235-73, creating the Liberty Homes Street Lighting Improvement Special Taxing District; and

WHEREAS, on January 29, 2002, this Board adopted Ordinance No. 02-12, providing a procedure for upgrading facilities and services within existing street lighting special taxing districts; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the procedure set forth in Ordinance No. 02-12, residents of the Liberty Homes Street Lighting Improvement Special Taxing District have requested consideration of upgrading the street lighting facilities and services within that District,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the County Mayor or Mayor's designee, in accordance with Ordinance No. 02-12, is hereby directed to prepare a report regarding the feasibility and cost of upgrading the street lighting systems serving the Liberty Homes Street Lighting Improvement Special Taxing District. The County Mayor or Mayor's designee shall present the report to this Board within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution and shall place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Barbara J. Jordan. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Xavier L. Suarez** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
