



SUBJECT: Resolution Approving the Expenditures of Funds from the Miami-Dade Police
Department Law Enforcement Trust Fund in the Amount of \$2,903,000.00

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee expenditures of \$2,903,000.00 from the Miami-Dade Police Department's (MDPD) Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETf) in accordance with the Report of Proposed Expenditures from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (Report). It is further recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to use such funds as described in the Report to be effective as of March 1, 2016.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Miami-Dade County will not incur any costs. LETf monies are awarded to the MDPD as a result of forfeiture litigation in State court and participation in federal asset sharing programs.

Track Record/Monitor

The LETf project is reviewed by Gustavo Knoepffler, Chief Financial Officer for the MDPD.

Delegation of Authority

The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is seeking authority to expend \$2,903,000.00 from the LETf in accordance with the Report of Proposed Expenditures from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund.

Background

On December 2, 1980, the LETf for Miami-Dade County was established by the Board through Resolution R-1633-80. The LETf must be used for law enforcement purposes that are not budgeted. Allowable purposes may include: to defray costs of protracted or complex investigations; to provide additional technical equipment or expertise; to provide matching funds to obtain federal grants; or for other law enforcement purposes. The funds are administered in compliance with MDPD's policies, statutory requirements, and federal guidelines.

The LETf is comprised of three (3) different funding sources: (1) the State civil forfeitures, governed by Sections 932.701-932.706 of the Florida Statutes; (2) U.S. Department of Justice Asset Sharing Program; and (3) the U.S. Treasury Asset Sharing Program. The LETf monies awarded to the MDPD are a result of forfeiture litigation in State court and federal asset sharing programs. Federal assets are shared among participating law enforcement agencies based on the agencies' direct participation in task force investigations that result in the forfeiture of federally seized assets. The Department's partnerships with

federal agencies and the related task forces have been the subject of recent resolutions approved by the Board.

LETF project requests are reviewed by the MDPD Law Enforcement Trust Fund Committee. The Committee approved requests are reviewed by personnel in the Fiscal Administration Bureau to ensure compliance with LETF requirements. The Police Legal Bureau reviews the requests for legal sufficiency and prepares the Report of Proposed Expenditures from the LETF. The revenues and expenditures are documented in the County budget ordinance, the federal equitable sharing and certification report, and an annual audit to the County's Finance Department. The package is certified by the Director of the MDPD prior to the Report being presented to the Board for approval per Section 932.7055(5)(b) of the Florida Statutes.

The proposed expenditures will become effective March 1, 2016, through completion of the projects. These expenditures include:

- 1) Targeted Operations, West District Agricultural Patrol Section - \$50,000
- 2) Domestic Crimes Investigations - \$75,000
- 3) Joint Roundtable on Youth Safety Continuation - \$250,000
- 4) Specialized Recruitment Strategies - \$200,000
- 5) Specialized Equipment/License Plate Readers - \$1,200,000
- 6) Specialized Equipment/Ballistic Plates and Carriers - \$526,000
- 7) Do The Right Thing Program - \$2,000
- 8) Targeted Crimes Initiative - \$600,000

These funds will support long-term, ongoing protracted or complex investigations and other allowable law enforcement expenditures in compliance with the MDPD's policies, statutory requirements, and federal guidelines.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE REQUEST TO EXPEND \$2,903,000.00 FROM THE MIAMI-DADE POLICE DEPARTMENT LAW ENFORCEMENT TRUST FUND; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO USE SUCH FUNDS FOR EXPENDITURES AS DESCRIBED HEREIN

WHEREAS, the Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying Report of Proposed expenditures, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board approves, pursuant to Section 932.7055, Florida Statutes, the request of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to expend \$2,903,000.00 from the Miami-Dade Police Department Law Enforcement Trust Fund for the purposes described in the accompanying Report of Proposed Expenditures (the "Report") which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference. This Board also authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to use such funds for the expenditures described in the Report, and that such expenditures will be effective March 1, 2016, through completion of the projects.

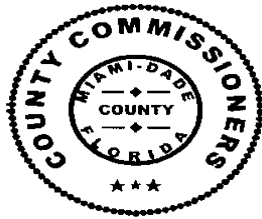

The Law Enforcement Trust Fund (Trust Fund) for Miami-Dade County was established by the Board of County Commissioners and must be used for law enforcement purposes which are not budgeted. Allowable purposes may include: to defray costs of protracted or complex investigations; to provide additional technical equipment or expertise; to provide matching funds to obtain federal grants; or for other law enforcement purposes. The funds are administered in compliance with Miami-Dade Police Department policies, statutory requirements, and federal guidelines.

The Law Enforcement Trust Fund is comprised of three different funding sources: the State civil forfeitures, governed by Florida Statutes Sections 932.701 through 932.706; U.S. Department of Justice Asset Sharing Program; and U.S. Treasury Asset Sharing Program. The Law Enforcement Trust Fund monies awarded to the Miami-Dade Police Department are a result of forfeiture litigation in State court and federal asset sharing programs.



1	Targeted Operations, West District Agricultural Patrol Section	\$50,000	Treasury	Trust Funds will support targeted operations for the West District Agricultural Section
2	Domestic Crimes Investigations	\$75,000	Treasury	Trust funds will support investigations which target domestic-related criminal offenses.
3	Joint Roundtable on Youth Safety Conferences	\$250,000	State Crime Prevention	Trust Funds will support police visibility for in and out-of-school safety initiatives and will continue the MDPD's implementation of recommendations of the Joint Roundtable on Youth Safety.
4	Specialized Recruitment Strategies	\$200,000	State Other Operating	Trust Funds will support specialized recruitment strategies including advertising, job fairs, recruitment venues, promotional items, and related activities to continue proactive recruitment strategies for diverse and professional applicants seeking a career in law enforcement.
5	Specialized Equipment - License Plate Readers	\$1,200,000	State Technical Equipment	Trust Funds will support specialized equipment, specifically, License Plate Readers at certain intersections.
