**A substitute was presented and forwarded to the BCC with a favorable recommendation at the 6-16-16 Trade and Tourism Committee. This substitute differs from the original item in that it eliminates the requirement for the County Mayor to include appropriate funding for the remaining cost of the Multi-use Path Project in the proposed FY 2016-2017 County Budget and any subsequent County Budgets as needed. Now, the County Mayor is only required to identify potential funding sources and report back to the Board within 60 days.**

RESOLUTION NO. R-675-16

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO DETERMINE THE COST OF DEVELOPING A MULTI-USE PATH AROUND THE PERIMETER OF MIAMI EXECUTIVE AIRPORT IDENTIFY POTENTIAL FUNDING SOURCES FOR THIS PROJECT AND PROVIDE A REPORT

**WHEREAS**, the Miami Executive Airport is an economic hub in southwest Miami-Dade County and the fifth busiest general aviation airport in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, the Miami Executive Airport is located in County Commission District 11; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board seeks to enhance the visibility of the Miami Executive Airport while improving the aesthetics and overall mobility of the southwest Miami-Dade County community; and

**WHEREAS**, American Trails, a national non-profit advocacy group, has documented various economic, community, and health benefits for various multi-use paths across the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, the Miami-Dade Aviation Department has identified aviation land along the perimeter of the Miami Executive Airport that may be used to develop a multi-use path, subject to approval by the Federal Aviation Administration and the Board ("Multi-use Path Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Miami Executive Airport's Multi-use Path Project is included in the current West End Connectivity Master Plan; and

>>WHEREAS, it is this Board's desire, prior to any development, to have the Multi-use Path Project included in the Miami-Dade County Long Range Transportation Plan and determined by the appropriate regulatory authorities to neither constitute "Section 4(f)" land, as that term is defined in the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 28, Part 774, nor impact Grant Assurance 5a or any other obligation imposed upon the Miami Executive Airport property by the Federal Aviation Administration; and<<<sup>1</sup>

WHEREAS, the Multi-use Path Project would improve the overall mobility of southwest Miami-Dade County by tying into the County's network of bike trails through a connection to the Black Creek Trail, which, once fully completed, will run through County Commission Districts 8, 9, and 11; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes the Miami Executive Airport Multiuse Path Project will also increase the visibility of the Miami Executive Airport and improve the overall aesthetics of southwest Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, as a result, the Board desires to ensure that the Multi-use Path Project at Miami Executive Airport receive appropriate funding for all facets of its development, including, but not limited to, costs associated with conveyance, construction, and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, approximately \$1.2 million of funding for the Multi-use Path Project has already been identified from District 11 district funds,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that this Board directs the County Mayor or Mayor's designee to: (1) determine the total cost of the Multi-use Path Project

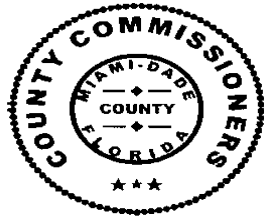
