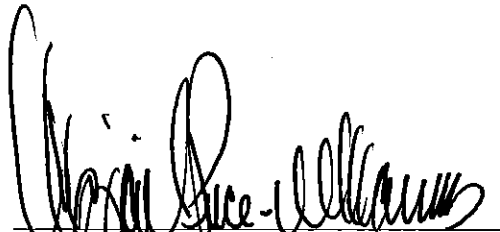

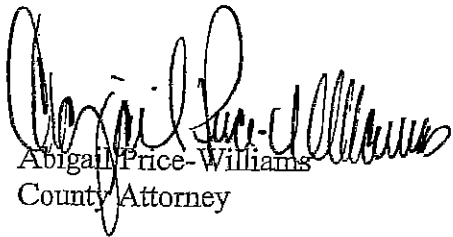

RESOLUTION NO. R-672-16

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR THE MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO PREPARE A REPORT REGARDING, AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE FEASIBILITY AND ADVISABILITY OF ESTABLISHING ON-DEMAND CIRCULATOR SERVICES FOR PASSENGERS TRAVELING TO OR FROM A TRANSIT FACILITY, SUCH AS A BUS STOP OR METRORAIL FACILITY

**WHEREAS**, public transportation is an essential element of Miami-Dade County's transportation system; and

**WHEREAS**, virtually every transit trip includes some non-transit component at the beginning or the end of the service including, but not limited to, walking, bicycling, skating, or for-hire transportation services ("the first and last mile"); and

**WHEREAS**, providing a reliable and affordable transportation service during the first and last mile is likely to increase ridership and decrease traffic on Miami-Dade County's roadways; and

**WHEREAS**, one option may be to provide on-demand circulator services for the first and last mile using taxicabs whose for-hire taxicab licenses have been newly issued to active taxicab chauffeurs through a lottery ("newly authorized taxicabs"); and

**WHEREAS**, an on-demand for-hire transportation service using newly authorized taxicabs may require the issuance of a substantial number of new taxicab for-hire licenses to taxicab chauffeurs; and

**WHEREAS**, the report being requested by this resolution is timely given that the administration is currently evaluating an on-demand flexible route circulator program; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor or the Mayor's designee should consider the potential solutions outlined in this resolution when formulating his recommendations regarding the first and last mile; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Commission believes that it is essential that the County facilitate reliable and affordable on-demand transportation services for the first and last mile,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that:

**Section 1.** The Mayor or the Mayor's designee is directed to prepare a report regarding the feasibility and advisability of providing on-demand circulator services to passengers traveling to or from a transit facility, such as a bus stop or Metrorail facility.

**Section 2.** The report shall outline the Mayor's recommendations regarding on-demand transportation services for the first and last mile and shall, at a minimum, consider the use of newly authorized taxicabs to provide on-demand circulator services for the first and last mile during peak commuter hours. Specifically, the report shall consider, among other options, the feasibility and advisability of issuing additional taxicab licenses to existing taxicab chauffeurs to provide on-demand circulator services for the first and last mile.

**Section 3.** The report shall also consider the feasibility and advisability of providing on-demand circulator services at no cost or a nominal cost to the passenger, and the provision of free County transit passes to individuals who utilize the first and last mile transportation options developed by the County. The Mayor or the Mayor's designee shall provide the report to the Board within 90 days of the effective date of this resolution and shall place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.

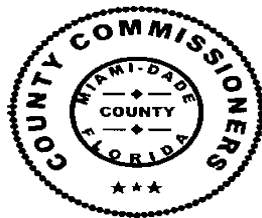
