



RESOLUTION NO. R-750-16

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CITY OF MIAMI CODESIGNATION OF SW 15TH AVENUE FROM SW 7TH STREET TO SW 8TH STREET AS “AZÚCAR AVENUE”; AND APPROVING THE CITY OF MIAMI’S CLARIFICATION OF ITS EXISTING CODESIGNATION OF NW/SW 15TH AVENUE FROM NW 1ST STREET TO SW 2ND STREET AS “AVENIDA LUIS MUÑOZ MARIN”

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2016 the Miami City Commission adopted Resolution No. R-16-0315, which codesignated SW 15th Avenue from SW 7th Street to SW 8th Street as “Azúcar Avenue”, in honor of Calle Ocho’s history, culture and distinction as well as Celia Cruz’s contributions to Calle Ocho; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. R-16-0315 also clarified its existing codesignation of “Avenida Luis Muñoz Marin” to run along NW/SW 15th Avenue from NW 1st Street to SW 2nd Street; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. R-16-0315 is attached hereto and incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, Calle Ocho, located on SW 8th Street in Little Havana, is the unofficial capital of Miami’s Cuban community; and

WHEREAS, Calle Ocho is known for its food, restaurants, Cuban coffee windows, cigar shops, music and cultural activities; and

WHEREAS, Cuban-American singer and popular salsa performer Celia Cruz is a major part of Calle Ocho’s music and cultural history; and

WHEREAS, Celia Cruz is well known for her signature catchphrase, “¡Azúcar!”; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to approve the City of Miami’s codesignation of SW 15th Avenue from SW 7th Street to SW 8th Street as “Azúcar Avenue”, and further wishes to approve the City of Miami’s clarification of its existing codesignation of NW/SW 15th Avenue from NW 1st Street to SW 2nd Street as “Avenida Luis Muñoz Marin”; and

WHEREAS, SW 15th Avenue from SW 7th Street to SW 8th Street and SW 15th Avenue from NW 1st Street to SW 2nd Street are City maintained roads located within the City of Miami and within County Commission District 5; and

WHEREAS, SW 15th Avenue intersects SW 8th Street in the heart of Little Havana, resulting in the “Azúcar Avenue” signage on SW 15th Avenue being displayed on Calle Ocho,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Approves the City of Miami codesignation of SW 15th Avenue from SW 7th Street to SW 8th Street as “Azúcar Avenue”.

Section 2. Approves the City of Miami’s clarification of its existing codesignation of NW/SW 15th Avenue from NW 1st Street to SW 2nd Street as “Avenida Luis Muñoz Marin”.

Section 3. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Mayor and City Manager of the City of Miami, the Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation, the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Transportation and Public Works Department, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department, the City of Miami Police Department, and the City of Miami Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Bruno A. Barreiro. It was offered by Commissioner **Sally A. Heyman**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **José "Pepe" Diaz** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MIAMI CITY COMMISSION CODESIGNATING SOUTHWEST 15TH AVENUE FROM SOUTHWEST 7TH STREET TO SOUTHWEST 8TH STREET, MIAMI, FLORIDA AS "AZUCAR AVENUE" AND CLARIFYING EXISTING CODESIGNATIONS; FURTHER DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO TRANSMIT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE HEREIN DESIGNATED OFFICES.

WHEREAS, Little Havana's tourism industry and importance as a cultural destination continues to grow; and

WHEREAS, Celia Cruz was a beloved Cuban-American singer and one of the most popular salsa performers of all time being well known for, among other things, her signature catchphrase, "¡Azúcar!"; and

WHEREAS, Celia Cruz's cultural achievements in the entertainment field merit the codesignation of a street in Little Havana to accompany her star on the Calle Ocho Walk of Fame; and

WHEREAS, the Miami City Commission wishes to honor Calle Ocho for its history, culture and distinction as a place for visitors from around the world by designating an avenue in Little Havana with the phrase "¡Azúcar!"; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The recitals and findings contained in the Preamble to this Resolution are adopted by reference and incorporated as if fully set forth in this Section.

Section 2. The City Commission codesignates Southwest 15th Avenue from Southwest 7th Street to Southwest 8th Street, Miami, Florida as "Azúcar Avenue".

Section 3. The City Commission clarifies that the existing codesignation of "Avenida Luis Muñoz Marín" is to be 15th Avenue from Northwest 1st Street to Southwest 2nd Street, Miami, Florida in order to comply with the Code of the City of Miami, Florida, as amended.

Section 4. The City Clerk is directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the City of Miami Police Department, the Fire-Rescue Department, Solid Waste Department, Miami-Dade County Department of Transportation and Public Works, and the United States Postal Service.

Section 5. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and signature of the Mayor. {1}

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Footnotes:

{1} If the Mayor does not sign this Resolution, it shall become effective at the end of ten (10) calendar days from the date it was passed and adopted. If the Mayor vetoes this Resolution, it shall become effective immediately upon override of the veto by the City Commission.
