

RESOLUTION NO. R-849-16

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
CODESIGNATE THAT PORTION OF NW 7TH AVENUE
FROM NW 52ND STREET TO NW 65TH STREET AS
“MUHAMMAD ALI BLVD”; AND APPROVING SUCH
CODESIGNATION

WHEREAS, born Cassius Clay in Louisville, Kentucky, on January 17, 1942,
Muhammad Ali became an Olympic gold medalist in 1960 and the world heavyweight boxing
champion in 1964; and

WHEREAS, Ali won the heavyweight title two more times in the 1970s; and

WHEREAS, Ali often told reporters he could “float like a butterfly, sting like a bee” in
the boxing ring and referred to himself as the “greatest”, eventually being dubbed “GOAT” or
the “Greatest of All Time”; and

WHEREAS, Ali’s greatness was not limited to the boxing ring; he devoted much of his
time to activism and philanthropy; and

WHEREAS, Ali retired from boxing in 1981 and announced that he had Parkinson’s
disease in 1984, and soon became involved in raising funds for the Muhammad Ali Parkinson
Center in Phoenix, Arizona; and

WHEREAS, Ali also supported the Special Olympics and the Make-A-Wish Foundation,
and traveled to numerous countries to help those in need; and

WHEREAS, in 1998, Ali was chosen to be a United Nations Messenger of Peace
because of his work in developing nations; and

WHEREAS, in 2005, he received the Presidential Medal of Freedom from President George W. Bush, and the President's Award from the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in 2009; and

WHEREAS, despite his passing on June 3, 2016, Ali's memory and legacy remains; and

WHEREAS, because that portion of NW 7th Avenue from NW 52nd Street to NW 65th Street is a state road, the Florida Legislature would be required to codesignate the road; and

WHEREAS, section 334.071, Florida Statutes, provides that the erection of markers for a state road designation shall be contingent upon the appropriate city or county commission passing a resolution in support of the particular honorary designation; and

WHEREAS, that portion of NW 7th Avenue from NW 52nd Street to NW 65th Street is located within the City of Miami and within County Commission District 3; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of Muhammad Ali by urging the Florida Legislature to codesignate that portion of NW 7th Avenue from NW 52nd Street to NW 65th Street as "Muhammad Ali Blvd", and approving the codesignation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to codesignate that portion of NW 7th Avenue from NW 52nd Street to NW 65th Street as "Muhammad Ali Blvd".

Section 2. Approves the state road codesignation of that portion of NW 7th Avenue from NW 52nd Street to NW 65th Street as "Muhammad Ali Blvd".

Section 3. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, the Senate President, the House Speaker, the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation, the Mayor and City Manager of the City of Miami, the Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation, the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Transportation and Public Works Department, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department, the City of Miami Police Department, and the City of Miami Fire Rescue Department.

Section 4. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2017 State Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Audrey M. Edmonson. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Daniella Levine Cava** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
