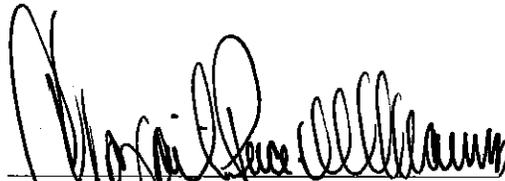

RESOLUTION NO. R-871-16

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING THAT PORTION OF SW
26TH STREET/CORAL WAY BETWEEN SW 127TH AVENUE
AND SW 132ND AVENUE E. AS "TIGER WAY"

WHEREAS, W.R. Thomas Middle School is a high achieving, culturally diverse and digitally oriented public school in Miami-Dade County that has been serving the West Kendall community since 1972; and

WHEREAS, W.R. Thomas Middle School offers the internationally respected and renowned Cambridge International Curriculum through a Magnet Program that allows students from all over Miami-Dade County the opportunity to learn, develop ideas and compete cognitively alongside the best and brightest young minds in our community; and

WHEREAS, the Cambridge Magnet Program attracts students from public, charter and private schools that are looking for a challenging educational experience that will fully hone their skills and ability; and

WHEREAS, W.R. Thomas Middle School also offers regular education, English Language Learner and Special Education Programs to meet the needs of all students and their families that reside in our community; and

WHEREAS, the school mascot of W.R. Thomas Middle School is the tiger; and

WHEREAS, W.R. Thomas Middle School is located at 13001 SW 26th Street; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of W.R. Thomas Middle School and its many years of service to the West Kendall community, this Board would like to codesignate that portion of SW 26th Street/Coral Way between SW 127th Avenue and SW 132nd Avenue E. as “Tiger Way”; and

WHEREAS, between SW 42nd Street/Bird Road and SW 26th Street/Coral Way, SW 132nd Avenue splits into SW 132nd Avenue and SW 132nd Avenue E.; and

WHEREAS, that portion of SW 26th Street/Coral Way between SW 127th Avenue and SW 132nd Avenue E. is a County-maintained road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 11,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates that portion of SW 26th Street/Coral Way between SW 127th Avenue and SW 132nd Avenue E. as “Tiger Way”.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Miami-Dade Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade County Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Juan C. Zapata. It was offered by Commissioner **Audrey M. Edmonson**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Sally A. Heyman** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
